

**IS ELECTED  
OFFICIALLY**

**Fred Stork Declared Member of  
Dominion Parliament by  
Majority of 38.**

Fred Stork was officially declared elected member of parliament for Skeena constituency early this afternoon, by R. W. Cameron, returning officer, following the official count of votes for the recent federal election. Returning Officer Cameron, Election Clerk C. V. Evitt, F. G. Dawson, Mr. Stork's agent, and D. G. Stewart, Colonel Peck's agent, were present in their official capacities at the count and, besides, there were other interested persons on hand. Following the announcement, Mr. Stork, who was also present, was congratulated by those around and he replied, mentioning the efficient and fair way in which the election had been managed.

The final count shows that Mr. Stork has a majority of 38 over Colonel Peck. The detailed vote was as follows:
