**SPOOK GIRL SUFFERS EXTREME HYSTERIA**

Professor of Psychology Says She Is a Moron and Unstable

NEW YORK, Oct. 31. — (By Canadian Press).—The report from Halifax that Mary Ellen, made famous last spring by the "spook" investigations at Antigonish, Nova Scotia, has been placed in an insane asylum, did not prove a surprise to Dr. Walter Franklin Pierce, President of the American Society for Psychical Research, who spent some time in Antigonish. Dr. Pierce regards this rather as a confirmation of his solution of the mystery.

However, he adds, Mary Ellen may not be insane in the proper sense of the term. Many asylums, he remarks, take cases of extreme hysteria and the like, because there are no proper institutions for treating such ailments.

After Dr. Pierce had spent three night in Mary Ellen's home last March, with a view to running down to their source the ghostly manifestations, he declared that Mary Ellen herself was responsible for them all.

Mary Ellen's case, says Dr. Pierce, is what he would call mental immaturity and nervous instability. She is intellectually inferior—what is called a "moron." In Antigonish, he says, they tell many ghostly tales. Probably Mary Ellen was much excited by these, and was afraid in the dark. Her hysteria was conceivably an "objectification" of the stories she had heard, and a reenactment of them by her in a sort of somnambulistic state.

And to cap all this, the notoriety which she gained was very bad for the girl.

**MAY BE REPUBLICAN PRESIDENT IN 1924**

Beveridge also in the Running Should Harding Decide to Step Aside

WASHINGTON, Oct. 31.—By Canadian Press.—Governor Miller, of New York, is suddenly beginning to command national notice as the possible nominee of the republican party for President in 1924. If Governor Miller is re-elected and is able to conduct his administration of state affairs for the next year and a half successfully, there is every indication that a most formidable movement for his nomination for President will be organized. This will be the case especially if President Harding says he will not accept another term in the White House. It may be the case regardless of President Harding.

There is said to be some little opposition to President Harding in his own party and it is quite conceivable that if he seeks another nomination there will be a fight over it, while, if he drops out, and leaves the field wide open, there will be the hottest kind of a struggle. Signs are not wanting that the movement for Governor Miller, provided he is re-elected, will be pressed quite regardless of the plans of Mr. Harding.

Up to date, the Miller boom and the Beveridge boom for 1924 are the most conspicuous of the presidential movements, as far as the republican camp is concerned. Senator Pepper of Pennsylvania may develop a strong following, and there will be support for Johnson of California, Borah of Idaho, and Former Senator Kenyon of Iowa.

**PRINCE GEORGE**

The Supreme Court Assizes opened here yesterday. Mr. Justice Murphy presiding. There are three criminal cases down for hearing: Rex vs. G. A. Ross, alias Baker, charged with false pretences under two counts; Rex vs. J. J. Barry, forgery in endorsing a check.

At a meeting held in the home of Mrs. Danell last week it was decided to form a British-Israel Society in Prince George. Fifteen persons were present.

**RUBBER BLOCKS FOR LONDON STREETS**

LONDON, Nov. 1. — Streets paved with gold were a fiction in the days of Dick Whittington. London's first Lord Mayor, but streets paved with rubber are distinct possibilities of the near future.

A test is being made in St. Martin's Lane with rubber blocks instead of wood and asphalt, and although the former is far more expensive, it is hoped it will last 25 years as against 12 to 14 years for wood block paving.
