A letter from Rev. G. G. Hacker acknowledging his appointment to the municipal free library board was received and filed by the city council last night.

A letter from George Rorie, president of the local Boy Scouts, acknowledging with thanks the grant of \$100 and the promise of the council to patronize the concert tonight was received and filed by the city council last night.

George Scott, of Ninth Avenue West, has written to the city council asking that access be given to his property which has become blocked in the course of street grading work. The latter was referred to the Board of Works for action by the city council last night.

A. A. Eason, of the Royal Bank staff, is expected back from Vancouver on the Prince George tomorrow. Mr. Eason was called to Saskatoon to give evidence in a court case there and while returning here attended the funeral of his father who died in Vancouver recently.

A recommendation from the Board of Works asking leave to suspend the city engineer to prepare a bylaw limiting the weight of loads to be carried on the city streets was adopted by the council last night. Speaking to the report, Mayor Rochester said such a bylaw was needed now in order to protect the streets which were being surfaced. The report was adopted.

The city streets bylaw is to be amended to provide for the closing of streets where repairs are in progress. Up to the present time there has been no such provision made in the bylaws. The city engineer will now have authority to close any street and it shall be unlawful for any person to drive on a street where signs are posted to the effect that it is closed.

Hon. A. M. Manson, attorney general, has written to the city council thanking that body for the appreciation expressed of his services on his recent trip to Ottawa as civic delegate. He had deemed it a privilege to act and would always be ready to serve the city. The expense account for the trip will be forwarded later. The letter was filed at the council meeting last night.

The city is to make application to the provincial government asking that the water license held by the city on Shawatlans Lake be cancelled and permission be given to hold the rights there as an unrecorded water reserve. The city, under the present license, is paying a heavy rental which is deemed unnecessary since the lake cannot be used for power purposes and only on rare occasions will be necessary for water supply. If the change is made in the recording it will be held under the same status as other streams in the vicinity of the city.
