## Loans Made to Officers Merchants Bank are big Loss; Security was Poor

MONTREAL, Feb. 9 .- The shareholders of the Merchants Bank last night voted to sell out to the Bank of Montreal, so the deal, which has been awaiting the confirmation of the shareholders, can now be definitely put through. Sufficient proxies were secured to obtain control and pass such action.

Among the big losses suffered by the Merchants Bank was \$2,000,000 in loans to officers of the bank. These loans were for automobiles and houses for the officers and also for the purchase of stocks and bonds.

The loans were shown in the report of H. B. Mackenzie, examiner of the assets of the bank, who reports that in some cases the Securities were deficient and in a few cases seriously deficient.

PARIS, Feb. 9 .- The famous pearl necklace which belonged to Maria Theresa, the famous Queen of Hungary in the eighteenth century, has been bought by Jefferson Davis Company of England. The necklace was on exhibition here and the purchase price was £200,-000. It was more valuable as an antique than as a gem.
