## Twenty Years Ago

In Prince Rupert

November 18, 1912

The wedding of Miss Margaret Agnes Moore of Bangor, Maine, and Henry G. Helgeson of Prince Rupert took place recently in Bangor, Maine. The couple are expected in Prince Rupert soon to take up residence.

Ralph Smith and Duncan Ross were the principal speakers at a great Liberal rally held before a crowded audience in the Westholme Theatre.

There was considerable excitement in Prince Rupert's wholesale section shortly before noon today as a result of an unusually heavy blast which was set off in the excavation next to the warehouse of Kelly, Douglas Co. One rock crashed through the roof of the Kelly, Douglas warehouse and landed only a few feet from where Mr. Jardine, the manager, was standing. Another large rock went through the roof of the G. T. P. freight shed.

## NO TRACE IS FOUND

Police Back After Another Search For Napoleon Labelle

After putting in another four days of investigation of the disappearance of Napoleon Labelle, who has been missing for the past few weeks from Georgetown, Staff Sergeant Alex McNeill and party of provincial police officers returned to the city last evening on the police boat P. M. L. 3 from Port Simpson. There are no new developments in the case although there is reason to suppose that there may be before long.

Meantime, reports current in the city that the body had been found shot to death were stated by the police to be without truth or foundation.

## Son of Former Local Couple Dies in South

Friends in this city will sympathize with Mr. and Mrs. J. A. Fleming, formerly of Prince Rupert, in their bereavement by the death on Sunday of this week in Vancouver of their only son, Thomas Airth, at the age of eleven years. The lad passed away only a few days after his father had left hospital in Vancouver where he had undergone two serious operations. The father, indeed, is still in a very weak condition. The funeral took place in Vancouver on Wednesday.

Mr. Fleming was formerly a member of the crew of the lighthouse tender Birnie and also was lighthouse keeper at Triple Island for four years.
