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CHINA REALLY IS AWAKENING

Great Enmity Against Japan Being Manifested, Bishop Asserts—No Boxer War.

CHICAGO, May 15.—China is becoming more self-assertive and self-dependent since the early days of the Washington Conference, says Bishop Francis J. McConnell, resident Bishop of Pittsburgh of the Methodist Episcopal Church who has been visiting in China recently.

Bishop McConnell is a member of the Educational Commission of the Missions Board of America and Great Britain who were sent to China six months ago. His statement was made public by a Committee on Conservation and Advance of the Methodist Church here.

"There are sure signs of the stirring of a Chinese public opinion and of Chinese national sentiment in advance of anything yet observed there," the Bishop said.

Speaking of the relations of the Japanese and Chinese, Bishop McConnell said: "The Japanese have made one notable failure and that is they have failed to make a friend of China. One does not have to be in a Chinese city long to note the intensity of the enmity of the Chinese toward the Japanese. He is utterly blind who rates this enmity as of no practical consequence in view of Japanese superiority in arms.

Boycott Weapon.

"The Chinese have found in the boycott a powerful weapon. With consummate genius for non-cooperation and passive resistance, China can free herself from all outside influence which she chooses to ban—when the time comes. And the time is coming soon in the years just ahead when China will inevitably come to a self-assertive, self-respecting independence of foreign nations. This is a plain-as-day fact that a stroller on Chinese streets cannot miss.

"I do not think there is danger of another Boxer uprising. At least if there is such a rising the weapons used will not be swords and guns."

Bishop McConnell said that the presence of an ever growing liberal sentiment—not necessarily a liberal party—in Japan is not a myth. "If Japan does not embark upon a career of imperialistic conquest of China in the next ten years it is not likely that she ever will," he declared. "By 1932 the democratic forces will probably be, if not

RUSSIANS WILL NOT EAT CROWS

Famine Sections Infested With
Big Black Scavenger Birds.

BUZULUK, Samara Province, Russia, May 15.—(The Associated Press).—Eating crow seems literally to have been the one thing the famine-stricken peasants of the Volga have refused to do. During the worst periods of the hunger suffering, when cats, dogs, clay and even more ghastly food substitutes have been greedily devoured, the country has been full of big, black and gray crows. So bold are these scavenger birds and apparently so uninterested by even the hungriest peasants, that some of them even perch upon and peck at meat supplies laden in sleds for transport from the railway stations to the villages.

Fattest in Country.
Some of them may have been eaten, but the correspondent saw literally hundreds of them at every place his train stopped from Samara on the way to Orenburg.

They were the fattest creatures in the famine area. Peasants with whom the correspondent talked on this apparent anomalous condition, in a region where one instance of cannibalism had been reported, admitted that crows might be as good to eat as dogs or cats, but advanced various vague reasons as to why these birds had not been slaughtered for food.

Some said there were no guns or ammunition to shoot them and that they were extremely hard to trap or catch. Others said they were "unclean."

AFFECTION OF SWedes SHOWN FOR MONARCH

STOCKHOLM, May 15.—The slight but painful injury sustained by King Gustave of Sweden in an automobile accident near Nice on the French Riviera has revealed more the affection which the Swedes cherish for their monarch. The accident caused great anxiety throughout Sweden, even after it was officially announced that the King's hurts were not serious, for the King is rather frail and nearly 64 years of age.

King Gustave has chosen Nice as his favorite haunt and playground when he seeks relaxation and recuperation from the cares of state and he is one of the most popular and welcome guests of the resort. His amusements there included playing bridge with friends and tennis with Mlle Lenglen, the French champion, and Earl Balfour.

A Great Sport.
In spite of his age, King Gustave still plays a brilliant tennis game and is looked upon as one of the best amateur players of Sweden. A stiff game of tennis or bridge always puts him in good humor and his wit is often quoted throughout the Riviera.

The French newspapers have been publishing a story of a little incident that occurred at Nice to illustrate his wit. The King had Mlle. Lenglen a his tennis partner and she was playing on the right hand side of the court. The King frequently encroached on her territory in his zeal to return the ball, whereupon Mlle. Lenglen admonished him to "keep to the left, Your Majesty," and once gave him a gentle push.

At the end of the game the King is reported to have said to his partner: "You remind me of my premier for you are always telling me to keep to the left."

Premier Branting of Sweden is head of the Socialist Party, which in parliamentary language is called "the left."
