In the Letter Box
BETTER COMMUNICATION
Editor, Daily News.
Undoubtedly, Prince Rupert has been undergoing changes and developments in the last few years, which no town need be ashamed of. "Excellent," I have advised "Excellent" as my satisfaction and my imagination has shown a picture of certain subjects which require attention in the near future.
In the last few days I have had occasion to approach certain business men in the city regarding the situation as to out-of-town business, that is, the prospects for Prince Rupert merchants and business men to transact business in the various mining camps and other numerous industrial towns of which Prince Rupert is the commercial center.
In one particular instance I mentioned the possibilities for Rupert firms to capture the business of the fast developing town of Stewart. The response was that it required too long a period between boats to make such business practical or profitable. The same condition would be the case with the various other outlying camps.
Now, you must admit that Rupert's future is dependent, to a large extent, on the prosperity of the surrounding industrial camps. That is, if Rupert expects to grow.
In order to render any aid to the business men of Rupert or the prosperity of the camps, communications must be improved to such an extent that

daily contact can be made possible. This is an age of outboard suggestions, and undoubtedly some of my words will be treated with ridicule. To be serious, I would suggest that: Business men of Rupert, show your respective powers. Utilize the shipbuilding company at the yard to construct steel boats of a size capable of making the average weather at sea. Build them of a standard size and type. Install Diesel or heavy duty gas engines. These boats when properly built, will last a life-time at a minimum cost for upkeep, fuel, crew and so forth. Your wonderful country is opened up and developed as it should be. This type of steel boat would undoubtedly prove efficient in the halibut fishing also.
Now, you members of the Board of Trade and Rotary Club if you want to show the rest of British Columbia your superior enterprise, eye, even to the rest of Canada, wake up or you're sure miss the parade.
In apology, Mr. Editor, if my imagination has slipped a cog or something, I hope you'll overlook this letter.
