## EDITOR APPOINTED LONDON LABOR PAPER

LONDON, Oct. 4. — Hamilton Fyfe, who has become editor of the Daily Herald, began his journalistic career on The Times and later on made his name as a special correspondent. His attempt as a practical journalist to set the Labor newspaper upon its feet will be watched with interest. Labor has not been fortunate hitherto in its experiment in daily journalism, and heavy losses have been incurred. The Trade Union Congress in private session decided to share with the Labor Party financial responsibility for the continued publication of the Daily Herald, which will now presumably be the official organ of the Labor movement.
