WEATHER STATIONS IN ARCTIC CIRCLE

Canada and United States Asked to Join in Norwegian Project

WASHINGTON, Nov. 9. — (By Canadian Press.)—Canada is to be asked to participate in an international project for the establishment of a chain of weather stations along the Arctic circle. The scheme has been launched by Prof. Eckerold, one of the foremost weather-experts in Norway, who is now in Washington interesting the U. S. Weather Bureau in his plan. The Arctic stations, experts say, would increase the period for making accurate forecasts from one week to two—in other words, double the efficiency of the weather service.

LETTER REGARDING ISLAND HIGHWAY

C. V. Exill, secretary of the Board of Trade this morning received a letter from Hon. Dr. J. H. Sutherland, minister of public works at Victoria in connection with the Board's resolution for a highway around Kaien Island. The minister drew attention to the proportions which the federal and provincial governments would pay for such a road and promised to take the matter up with the Dominion authorities as soon as possible.

LONDON, Nov. 9. — Jolly old chappies of four-score years and ten, frolicing on the Oxford playgrounds, and dodging septuagenarians tolling in cushioned punts on the upper reaches of the Thames, may become realities if the plan for the entry of the old as well as the young to the famous English university is carried out.

The suggestion is that a college be established for adults, as Ruskin College was established for the education of men from trades unions. Such a college it is pointed out, would be a haven of refuge for extra mural activities of the university, and would enable many adults to carry on studies which they started under the extension course idea and which they have been unable to complete.
