PRISONERS ARE STILL HELD IN RUSSIAN CAMPS

Terrible Condition of Men and Women Held for Political Offenses.

MOSCOW, May 5.—(The Associated Press)—To prevent the death by starvation and disease of 200,000 or so men and women in the various prisons and concentration camps of Russia, collections are being taken in the churches by the priests and about the streets by ex-prisoners or by friends and relatives of prisoners.

Despite the amnesty proclamation of the Soviet government in November last, the prisons and camps continue crowded with men and women political prisoners whose only crime appears to have been that they once were rich or that they fell afoul of old enemies who used their Communist influence to avenge private grievances.

Conditions have been going from bad to worse since the famine until now prison means to be practically without food, clothes, heat or medicine. The organization known as the Russian political Red Cross has had its meager supplies and funds cut off, along with schools, hospitals and other institutions.

The people in the famine region are in a paradise compared to those who are denied their liberty and all means of obtaining food.

Eating Refuse.

In the camps of Novosibirsk and Pokrofsky, near Moscow, to the certain knowledge of The Associated Press correspondent, the prisoners are reduced to eating bits of refuse, like hungry animals. The best that is served them is greasy hot water called

Some women political prisoners have been released, but the correspondent has information that aged and middle-aged princesses, mothers and daughters and wives, are still detained in overcrowded lice-infested cells or rooms with but one piece of clothing to cover them and without soap to wash themselves.

Once such people as these get into prison they stay there almost automatically because they are of no special political importance in present-day Soviet Russia.

The Cheka (secret police) authorities has just offered to send 100 real political prisoners—Social Revolutionists or Mensheviks—to some small town they may select at least 150 miles from a railway if they will promise to remain there. They are now locked up in the Boutirsky prison at Moscow and thus far have refused the offer. Nevertheless a dozen or so of the prisoners have been released.

Menshevik Leader.

Among the 100 is M. Tchernov, leader of the Menshevik party and chief of the Constitutional Assembly of January, 1918. This particular group worked for a time with Admiral Kolchak organizing the people's party in Siberia.

Mensheviks were arrested by the hundreds in every political centre of Russia and are still in various prisons.

Other political prisoners are anarchists, the cadets of Professor Milukoff, former Russian Foreign Minister, officers and relatives with the various "white" and volunteer movements of the old Imperialist sets including men from the Denikine and Wrangel armies.

In addition, there have been scattered through north and central Russian prisons and camps men connected with the efforts to establish independent republics in Georgia, Azerbaijan, the Kuban and other sections of south Russia and the Caucasus, including Turkestan.

M. Unsicht, the new chief of the Cheka, has refused to give American correspondents information on the prisons and the causes of the arrests. A year ago the cheka issued a report which was suppressed on issue.

NAKED MEN BRANDED WITH HOT IRONS IN PRISONS OF MOSCOW

BERLIN, May 5.—Fritz Nolde, a German business man, who has just been released from Butirka prison in Moscow and returned to Berlin, declares that there has been no modification of the treatment of prisoners there since the Moscow government announced that the dread Cheka and its methods were things of the past. Nolde said that from his cell window he saw naked men branded with hot irons and heard the cries of the victims.

Several Hungarian officers released with Nolde bore out his assertions concerning the cruelties inflicted upon prisoners.

launched on the lower coast and on three land stations. These telephones have proved of immense use in keeping the field and office in close touch in reporting fires and effecting the transport of men and equipment at a speed which would otherwise have been impossible. Logging machinery such as donkey engines and locomotives must be equipped with certain fire prevention appliances, and camps must be properly equipped with fire fighting tools. Portable gasoline pumps have lately been added to our equipment capable of pumping water a thousand feet.

"Every year some improvement in equipment or organization is made, with the result that in ten years since the inception of the provincial forest service, a fire fighting force has been built up which is second to none. The main principle of fire protection is the early detection of fire and quick arrival at the spot. Of the fires reported last year, over 1300 in number, 12 percent were restricted to less than one-quarter of an acre, another 33 percent between one-quarter and 10 acres, making 75 per cent of the total number.

These Responsible.

"We find that campers and travellers are responsible for starting 25 per cent of forest fires. Railroads come second, while lightning is responsible for only 10 to 15 per cent. We have therefore been conducting an educational campaign through our newspapers, signs, notices and other means.

"In our timber administration we are trying to find out what our capital stock of merchantable timber amounts to. Reconnaissance parties are out every summer mapping and cruising our timber areas and data is being gathered which will show how long it takes different classes to grow to merchantable size in different localities, and what the increment per acre will be.

"A natural resource as great as our timber, which provides one-quarter of our provincial revenue and of which still greater use will be made owing to the depletion in eastern supplies and increase of export, is surely worth being protected and treated as a perpetual crop. If you think so, give us your support because we cannot advance faster than public opinion."

A vote of thanks was passed to the speaker for his very eloquent address.
