## JOHN BULL'S LATE EDITOR

Extraordinary Career of Man who Was Recently Sentenced to Jail.

LONDON, June 23.—(by mail).—After sailing close to the wind for many years during which time he was often before the courts and cleverly defending himself, Horatio Bottomley is enjoying a period of peace in one of His Majesty's prisons. He has been connected with journalism and finance for many years, and during the war he capitalized his wonderful power of abuse by pouring out the vials of his wrath upon the Germans. It made him temporarily a hero and increased the circulation of John Bull to a wonderful extent.

**Admired Bradlaugh**  
Little is known of Mr. Bottomley's family. He was born on March 23, 1860, the only son, says "Who's Who," of William King of Bottomley and Elizabeth Holyoake. His uncle, for whom he used to revise proofs, was George Jacob Holyoake, the founder of the modern cooperative movement; and through him, no doubt, he came to know and admire Bradlaugh. The boy was educated at Mason College, Birmingham, and was started in the city at the early age of fourteen. One of his first jobs was with a firm of solicitors, who proved to be anything but respectable, and with them he was in the way of learning much that was wrong and little that was right. His next five years were spent in business and solicitors' offices, after which he joined an exclusive body known as the Institute of Short-hand Writers Practising in the Supreme Court of Judicature.

**First Newspaper**  
About 1885 he founded his first newspaper, the Hackney Herald, which recorded the proceedings of one of the local "parliaments," or debating societies.

### SYNOPSIS OF LAND ACT AMENDMENTS

Minimum price of first-class and reduced to \$5 an acre; second-class to \$2 50 an acre; third-class to \$1 50 an acre.

Pre-emption now confined to surveyed lands only.

Records will be granted covering any land suitable for agricultural purposes and which is non-timber land.

Partnership pre-emption abolished but parties of more than four may arrange for adjacent pre-emption with joint residence, but each making necessary improvements on respective claims.

Pre-emptors must occupy claims for five years and make improvements to the value of \$10 per acre, including clearing and cultivation of at least 1/2 acre before receiving title.

Where pre-emptor in occupation less than 2 years, and has made proportionate improvements, he may, by certificate of health, or other cause, be granted intermediate certificate of improvement and transfer his claim to another person.

Failure to make improvements or record same will operate as forfeiture. Title cannot be obtained less than 2 years, and improvements of \$10 per acre, including 1/2 acre cleared and cultivated, and residence of at least 2 years are required.

Pre-emptor holding Crown Grant may now apply for pre-emption. If he requires land in conjunction with his farm, without actual occupation, provided statutory improvement made and residence maintained on Crown granted land.

Unsurveyed areas, not exceeding 20 acres, may be leased as homesteads, title to be obtained after fulfilling residential and improvement conditions.

For grazing and industrial purposes areas exceeding 640 acres may be leased by one person or company.

Unimproved land not exceeding 40 acres may be purchased; conditions include survey of area.

Natural hay meadows inaccessible to existing roads may be purchased at 25c per acre, including 1/2 acre of them. Balance of one-half of cost of road, not exceeding half of purchase price, is made.

**PRE-EMPTORS' FREE GRANTS ACT.**  
The scope of this Act is enlarged to include all persons joining and serving with His Majesty's Forces. The one with which the heirs or devisees of a deceased pre-emptor may apply for title under the Act is extended from one year from the death of such person, as formerly, until one year after the conclusion of the great war. This privilege is also made retroactive.

No fees relating to pre-emption are due or payable by pre-emptors on pre-emption recorded after June 26, 1918. Taxes are remitted for five years.

Provision for return of moneys accrued, due and been paid since August 1, 1914, on account of payments, fees or taxes on soldiers' pre-emption.

Interest on agreements to purchase town or city lots held by members of Allied Forces, or dependents, acquired direct or indirect, remitted from enlistment to March 31, 1920.

**SUB-PURCHASERS OF CROWN LANDS**  
Provision made for issuance of Crown grants to sub-purchasers of Crown Lands, acquiring rights from purchasers who failed to complete purchase, in whole or in part, on fulfillment of conditions of purchase, interest and taxes. Where sub-purchasers do not claim whole of original parcel, purchase price due and taxes may be distributed proportionately over whole area. Applications must be made by May 1, 1920.

**GRAZING**  
Grazing Act, 1919, for systematic development of livestock industry provides for grazing districts and range administration under Commissioner. Annual grazing permits issued based on numbers raised, priority for established owners. Stock-owners may form Associations for range management. Free, or partially free, permits for settlers, campers or travellers, up to ten head.

ties, then so popular. It was successful, and he multiplied his Hansards in other parts of the Metropolis with characteristic speed. Other undertakings about this time ranged from a boys' paper to commercial, shipping, and municipal reviews, and later even to a mothers' magazine.

Having observed the success of the Financial News, and realizing "that in all class journalism there are invariably two successful papers," he founded the Financial Times, which he ultimately gave to his partner, while he, out of some printing works they owned, developed the famous Hansard Union. Trouble then arose with his debenture-holders, and a receiver was appointed. Of the ordinary share capital of £1,000,000 issued by the Hansard Union, nothing was left. A prosecution was instituted by the Crown, but Bottomley, who personally defended himself with great skill, was acquitted. Mr. Justice Hawkins was said to have sent for him afterwards and advised him to go to the Bar.

**Gold Mine Magnate**  
Instead, he went to the city and founded the Joint Stock Institute. He prospered, and by the middle 'nineties had become a magnate in the West Australian gold mining market and a very wealthy man. In addition to his many interests in the city, he was the Liberal candidate for South Hackney, and yet he could still find leisure to look after his theatrical speculations and his racing stables in Sussex, which he claimed never cost him a penny.

His successes included the Gresham, the Stewards' Cup, the Crawford Plate, the London Cup, the Earl Spencer's Plate, and the Prix de la Manche. His effort to revive the Sun was more costly, but before there was time for it to succeed his fortunes had begun to decline.

**Bubble Promoter**  
The Joint Stock Institute had already begotten many children, and now there were grandchildren. The West Australian Loan and General Financial Corporation Trust and kindred companies, the Associated Financial Corporations, of which there were several, the notorious Joint Stock Trust and Finance Corporation arose on the ashes of one another. Then came the unhappy christened Joint Stock Salvage Syndicate, and the anemic John Bull Investment Agency, thought by some to be a phantom. Bottomley conducted speculative operations, which certainly did not benefit the speculators. Some of them became vindictive, and he found himself increasingly involved in litigation. He had to face grave indictments. In 1908 he was again prosecuted by the Crown, and again he triumphed. Other cases did not end so happily. Mr. Hooley's name became linked with his. The judges criticized his doings severely, and once the executors of a speculative gentleman of eighty were awarded £50,000 damages, after which there had to be an apology in the House of Commons. Still, he was never convicted of fraud, and in all these cases he showed extraordinary skill as a lay lawyer.

**To Parliament**  
Some of his other ambitions in the meantime had materialized, he was returned to parliament as the Liberal member for South Hackney in 1906 by a large majority, and in the same year he founded John Bull, his most successful undertaking. Mrs. Bull followed, but in 1911 the failure
