STRANGE EXPERIENCE OF FISH BOAT SCRUB

Arrived in Port Safely After Hitting Rock off Williams Island.

The halibut boat Scrub, Capt. Prince, had a rather exciting experience when coming into port a few days ago with her catch. She struck a rock at Williams Island off the mouth of the harbor, and keeled over with her keels under water. The mast went over so far as to pick up seaweed on the rigging. As the tide dropped the stern freed itself and the boat took a nose dive after which she righted herself. Although her stern was rather badly damaged she was able to continue into port all right and neither the crew nor the cargo were damaged. The little ship is undergoing repairs in the dry dock.

ALD. COLLART WILL MOVE FOR DEMOLITION OF PHOENIX THEATRE

Ald. Theo. Collart is to bring his views regarding the old Phoenix Theatre before the city council in the form of a motion, notice of which has been posted as follows:

"That whereas a certain building, to wit the Phoenix Theatre situated on Second Avenue East, is in such a state as to be a nuisance and dangerous to the public safety and whereas the owner or agent thereof has been notified to put the same in habitable condition or demolish it and has failed to do so, therefore be it resolved that the council proceed to exercise its power under the Municipal Act and order the building demolished, the expense to be charged to the owner as provided for under the Act.

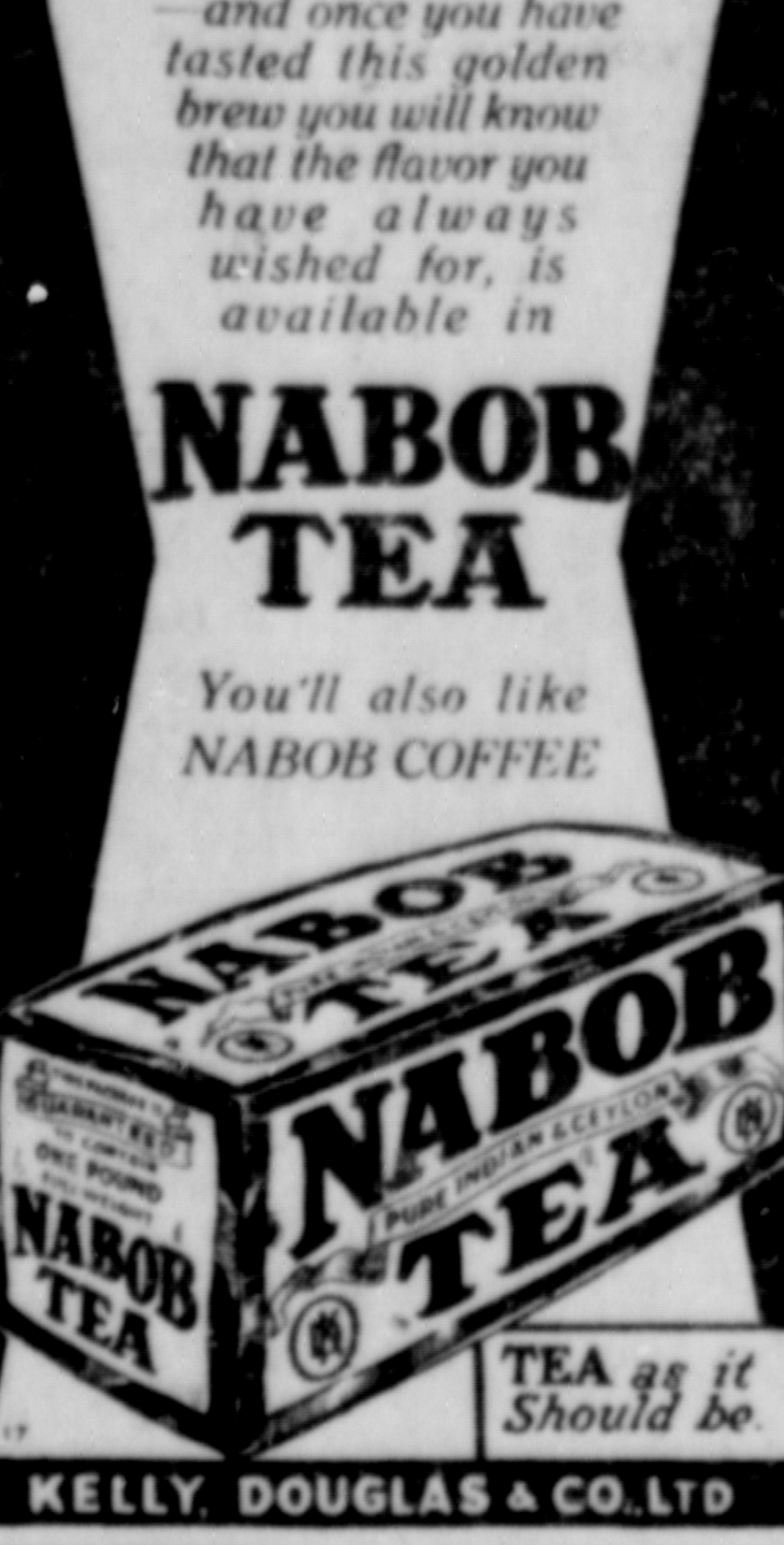

CONTINUATION SCHOOL PROPOSAL ENDORSED BY BOARD OF TRADE

The scheme for a correlated system of continuation schools for the district, as put forward by the Ayoos Community League was dealt with by the Board of Trade last evening and was referred, with a favorable recommendation, to the consideration of the School Board. J. Pinder-Moss, organizer of the Granby Bay polytechnic and mover of the scheme, addressed the meeting and fully outlined the proposal. He was accorded a vote of thanks by the Board.

LOCAL ASSESSMENT TOWARDS STARTING OF RATES BUREAU

Prince Rupert's assessment towards the establishment of a freight rates bureau in Vancouver, as proposed by the Board of Trade of that city, will be \$50. A letter to this effect was received by the local board last night from the Associated Boards of Trade and was referred to the Finance Committee with the recommendation that the assessment be paid. Vancouver's assessment is \$2500 and it was felt that since the bureau would be of great importance to this city the payment of the reasonable assessment allotted would be a well-warranted expenditure.

NEW STATION WILL BE FULLY OPENED BY NEXT MONDAY

The new G.N.R. station will be opened for business next Monday when the ticket office moves in. The express and baggage departments took up their quarters on the first floor of the depot last night.

G. W. Fitzmaurice, who is working at Oceanic Cannery this summer, is spending the day in town. Fitz reports that the average per boat at the cannery yesterday was 40 with 100 high.

The salmon trolling boat Diamond T. hit a rock in Metlakatla Passage a couple of days ago while going to Oceanic Cannery and is now in the drydock undergoing repairs.

FISH ARRIVALS HEAVIER TODAY

Total of 140,000 Pounds Maitbut Marketed at Exchange this Morning.

Fish arrivals were heavier this morning, twelve boats having marketed 140,000 pounds of halibut at the Exchange. The price averaged between 11c and 12c for first class fish and 5c was paid in all cases for seconds. The arrivals and sales were as follows:
