Metric Plan Adopted by American Amateur Athletic Union at Annual Convention

NEW YORK, Nov. 24.—In a surprise move Tuesday, the American Amateur Athletic Union, in annual convention here, adopted the metric system of measurement to apply in future to all amateur track and field sports in the United States.

The Union, in another resolution, decided to conform with the regulation of the International Athletic Association whereby the winner of a race shall be decided when the chest, rather than the body, hits the tape.
