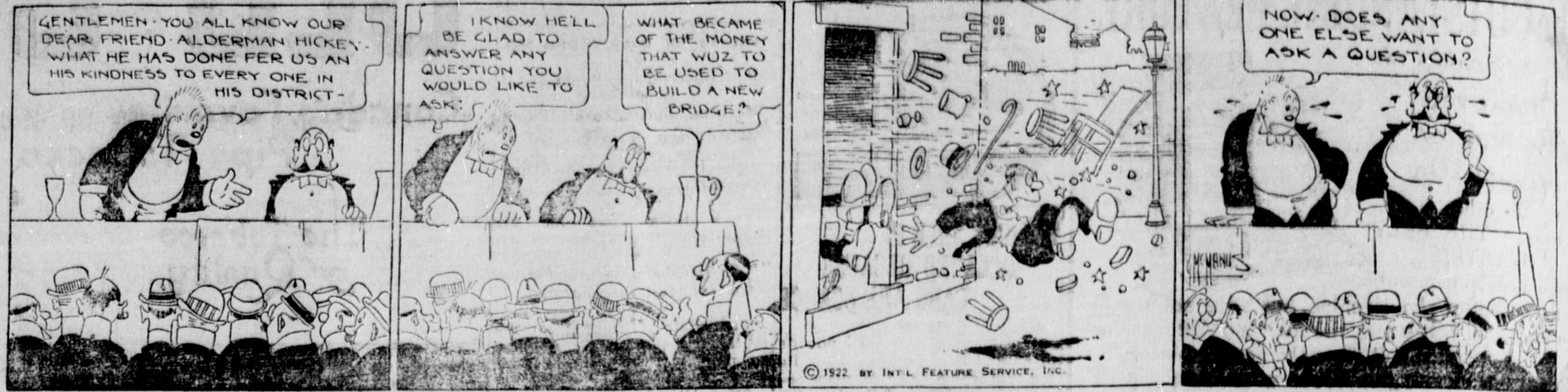

CROP ACREAGE ON PRAIRIES

Chief Increase This Year is in Saskatchewan Where Nearly Doubled.

Preliminary reports, recently issued by the governments of the prairie provinces, estimate the amount of land available for seeding this spring in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, at 16,468,548 acres, in comparison with 12,785,665 acres last year, says the Royal Bank report. This is exclusive of spring plowing. According to these estimates, the acreage is distributed by provinces as follows:

Last season threshing was completed earlier in Manitoba than in Saskatchewan. As frost did not interfere with plowing operations in the former province until November, relatively more fall plowing was accomplished there than in Saskatchewan. Last autumn, especially in September, there was an exceptionally heavy rainfall. This had an injurious effect on unthreshed grain at the time, but the benefit of the supply of moisture, which is still in the ground, will be felt during the present year.

The snowfall throughout Manitoba and Saskatchewan during the winter of 1921-22 was moderate. Early in March, a spell of warm weather took away a considerable amount of the snow. A storm some time later, however, was the beginning of a period of cold and unseasonable weather, with occasional falls of snow and rain. These unfavorable conditions caused a very considerable delay in the spring work on the land. Fortunately, however, more satisfactory weather during the latter part of April helped the situation somewhat.

Wheat seeding in Manitoba and Saskatchewan, during the last ten years, usually became general around the 20th of April. This year, seeding was not in full progress until about the 27th of April, in Manitoba, and a week later in Saskatchewan. Since then, fair progress has been made so far as Manitoba is concerned, and it is estimated that, by the end of the first week of May, 80 to 90 per cent of the wheat seeding was completed, and the seeding of coarse grains was well advanced. While the season is undoubtedly late, progress in Manitoba compares very favorably with that of last year, and it is anticipated that seeding will be completed in good time.
