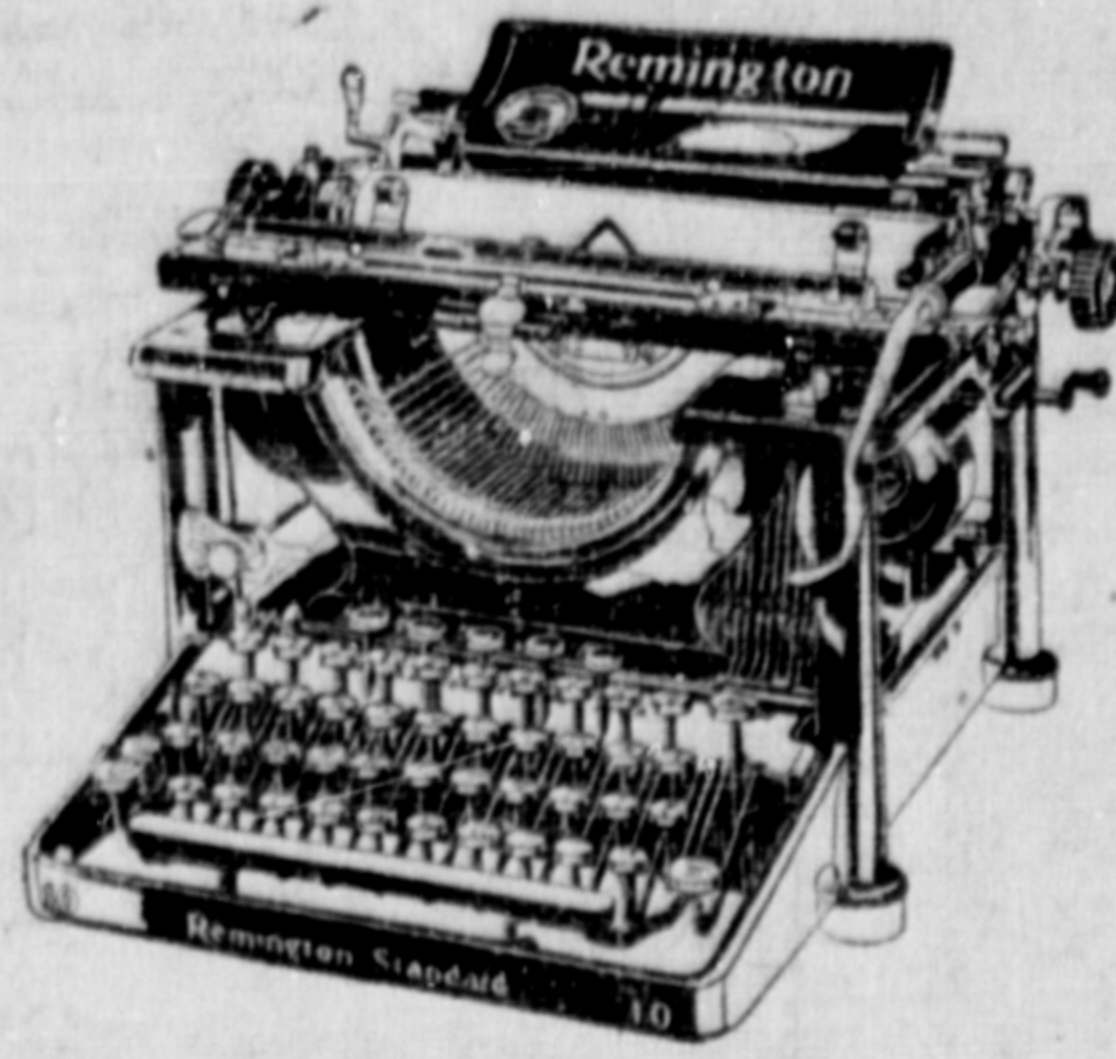

### HALIBUT SALE IS DELAYED BECAUSE CARS ARE SCARCE

One hundred thousand pounds of halibut is in port today awaiting sale which will take place tomorrow morning following the arrival tonight of eight more refrigerator cars from the East. The large amount of fish marketed recently exhausted all the cars available at this end and delay is thus caused the fish offering today.

The arrivals today include the Canadian Fish and Cold Storage Co.'s trawler, Andrew Kelly, which came in last evening with 17,000 pounds. The Kelly is operating on the independent lay and will sell over the Exchange like other vessels.

### GREATER TEA DEMAND FORCES PRICES UP

The increased consumption of tea in 1921 (during which year by agreement, the tea growers of Ceylon and India had curtailed production) forced the price of tea steadily upwards to the present abnormally high level. The lowering of the duty in England will mean still greater demand, and authorities on tea state that still higher prices may be expected.
