DRUM LUMMON MINE ACTIVE

Expected That Property Down Coast Will Be Shipping Ore to Anyox This Month

The Drum Lummon mine on Douglas Channel is looking well under development, on which about 30 men are engaged says the Mining and Engineering Record. An excellent dock has been constructed at Drum Lummon Bay. A shaft is being sunk to develop the ore body at 100 feet below the main level. A new ore-body, which has every appearance of strength, has been proved up east of the cross-cut tunnel, and while not carrying shoots of rich ore like other parts of the mine, is high grade as will be seen from the following assay: Gold, 0.01 oz.; silver 7.5 oz.; copper, 19.5 per cent.

The plant is being put on a substantial basis, motive power being supplied by a semi-Diesel engine, manufactured by the Snow Steam Pump Works of Buffalo, N.Y. The engine is a beautiful piece of machinery, of massive construction. It has cylinder 12 x 16 in., and air compressor operating up to 1000 lbs. pressure to start the engine. The fly wheel is 10 feet in diameter and the driving pulley 81 ins. The shaft is a massive forging. The engine is of such substantial construction that one piece alone weighs 13 tons.
