FIRST GOLD ON ISLANDS

First Coal in British Columbia Also Found There-Pioneer Railway at Skidegate

SKIDEGATE, Nov. 25:-The first gold discovery in British Columbia erick. was made at Port Kuper, Queen Charlotte Islands, in 1852 by Capt. Mitchell who was dispatched to that point by the Hudson Bay Co. in the brig Una.

First coal discovered in British Columbia was in Skidegate Inlet in 1859 by Mr. Downie and party.

The first railway to operate in British Columbia was in Skidegate Inlet, this road having been a marrow-gauge one, one mile in length, which was operated by the Queen Charlotte Mining Co. Ltd. of Victoria in 1865 at the coal mine known then as the Cowgitz coal mine. Coal was shipped to Victoria from this mine in 1869.
