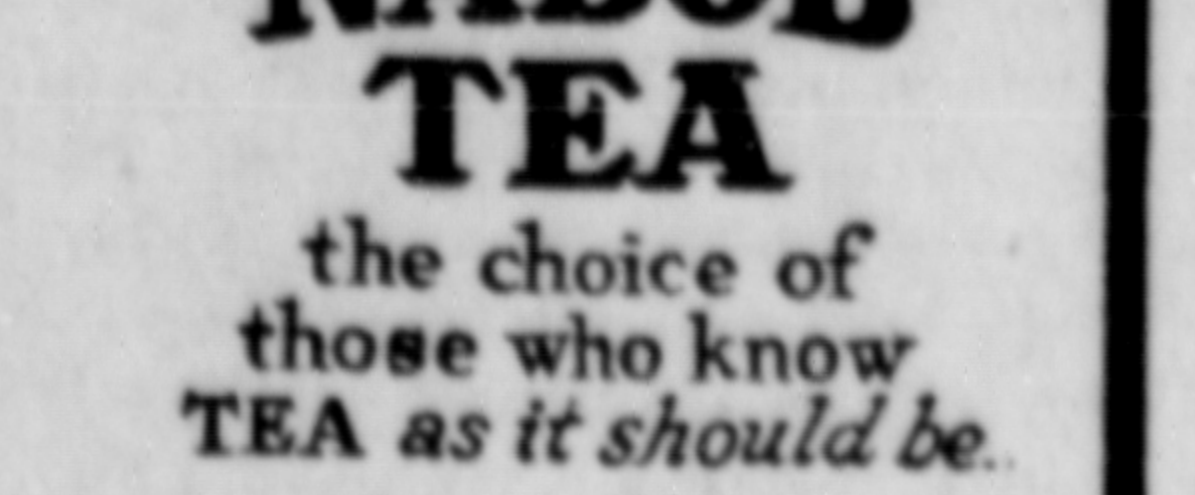

WELSH CHURCHES EMPTY TODAY AS MINISTERS LEAVE

LONDON, July 13.—Hundreds of Welsh Nonconformist churches are at present without pastors, and the Welsh pulpit is losing its best men. The preachers are migrating to English churches, where there are better salaries and more amenities, both being strong inducements.

The Congregationalists, for example, have approximately 250 pastorless churches, and other denominations are similarly placed. A remarkable feature of the situation is that, while there are so many "vacant" churches, there is only a small number of ministerial students at the Welsh colleges, and for those who are there completing their training, fewer "calls" than ever are forthcoming.

Synchronizing with the departure of some of the most powerful of the pulpiters for England is an exodus of ministers from the areas of South Wales to the agricultural counties. This is apparently due to the low wages prevailing in the coalfields, which make it impossible for churches to guarantee permanent and adequate salaries to ministers. It is also due, to some extent, to the general unrest there.

PROFESSOR SAYS HE WILL SEEK REDRESS FOR HIS DISMISSAL

WINNIPEG, July 12.—Prof. W. G. Smith, of the philosophy and sociology department of Wesley College, whose dismissal was announced officially by James H. Ashdown, chairman of the college board, will seek redress from the highest courts of the Methodist Church, and failing there, will carry his case to the civil courts of Canada, he declared.

He will charge the Wesley board with breach of a five-year contract, which he claims to have obtained from it last fall. He has served one year of this term. The board does not recognize the existence of any contract between itself and Prof. Smith, and has "let the professor out," Mr. Ashdown declared.

Insultation is the cause of the professor's dismissal, according to the board's announcement. It condemns his attitude at the recent Methodist conference, when, following Principal J. H. Riddell's report, he attacked the atmosphere of the college, and the practicability of the administration. Prof. Smith and Principal Riddell also have been at loggerheads several times during the term, it was said.

SYNOPSIS OF LAND ACT AMENDMENTS

Minimum price of first-class and reduced to \$5 an acre, second-class to \$2 an acre.
Pre-emption now confined to surveyed lands only.
Records will be granted covering only land suitable for agricultural purposes and which is non-timber land.
Partnership pre-emption abolished, but parties of not more than four may arrange for adjacent pre-emption with joint residence, but each making necessary improvements on respective claims.
Pre-emptors must occupy claims for five years and make improvements to value of \$10 per acre, including clearing and cultivation of at least a "reasonable" portion of the claim.
Records without permanent residence may be issued, provided applicant makes improvements to extent of \$50 per annum and records same each year. Failure to make improvements or record same will operate as forfeiture. Title cannot be obtained in less than 5 years and improvements of \$100 per acre, including 5 acres cleared and cultivated, and evidence of at least 2 years occupancy required.
Pre-emptor holding Crown grant may record another pre-emption, if he surrenders his claim, with his farm, without actual occupation, provided statutory improvements made and residence maintained on Crown grant land.
Unsurveyed areas, not exceeding 20 acres, may be leased as homestead, title to be obtained by purchase of residential and improvement conditions.
For grazing and industrial purposes areas exceeding 400 acres may be leased by one person or company.
Mill, factory or industrial sites on timber land not exceeding 40 acres may be purchased, conditions include payment of stumpage.
Natural hay meadows inaccessible to existing roads may be purchased conditional upon construction of a road 50 feet wide. Estimate of one-half of cost of road, not exceeding half of purchase price, is made.
PRE-EMPTOR'S FREE GRANTS ACT.
The scope of this Act is enlarged to include all persons joining and serving within the acquiring rights. The value of the pre-emption may apply for title under the Act is extended from one year from the death of such person, as formerly, until one year after the conclusion of the great war. This privilege is also made retroactive.
No fees relating to pre-emption are due or payable by soldiers or pre-emptors recorded after June 26, 1918. Taxes are remitted for five years.
Provision for return of money accrued due and been paid since August 1, 1914, on account of payments, less of taxes on soldiers' pre-emption.
Interest on agreements to purchase town or city lots held by members of Allied Forces or those who acquired direct or indirect, remitted from an instalment to March 31, 1920.
SUB-PURCHASERS OF CROWN LANDS.
Provision made for issuance of Crown grants to sub-purchasers of Crown lands, acquiring rights from purchasers who failed to complete purchase, involving forfeiture, no fulfillment of conditions of purchase, interest and taxes. Where sub-purchasers do not claim whole of original purchase price due and taxes may be distributed proportionately over whole area. Applications must be made by May 1, 1920.
GRAZING.
Grazing Act, 1915, for systematic development of livestock industry provides for grazing districts and range administration under Commission. Annual grazing permits issued based on numbers raised, priority for established owners. Stock-owners may form Associations for range management. Free, or partially free, permits for settlers, campers or travellers, up to ten head.
