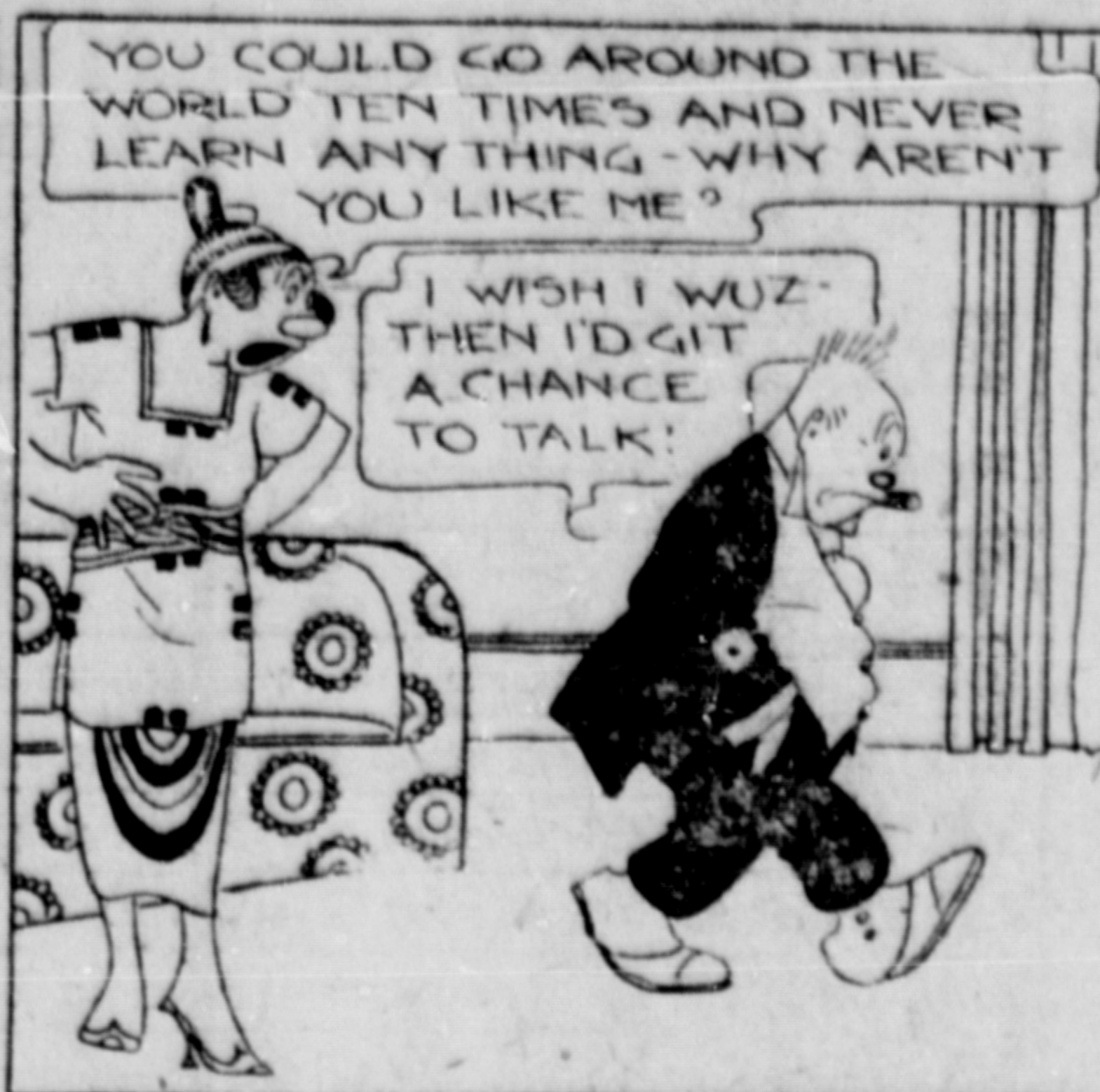
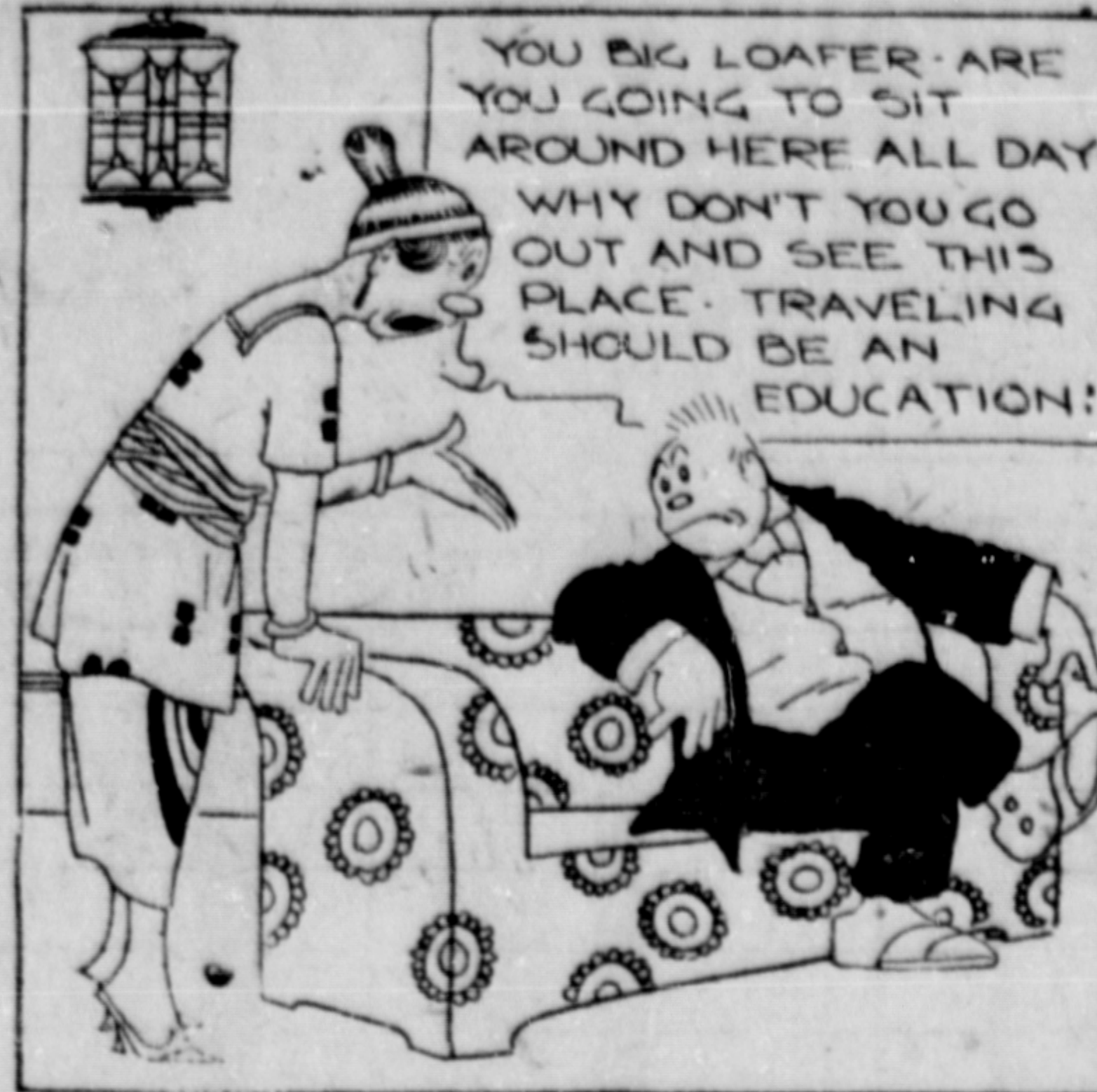

BRINGING UP FATHER



Some Sport Leaders Maintained Vantage in 1922 but, as usual, there were Some New Surprises

Each year produces champions in every line of sport and although some of the leaders manage to hold the titles, there are also contenders coming up who sooner or later win a title. A resume of some of the leading sport contests in Canada and the United States for the past year bears this out.

Canada's sensation on the track in 1922 was the Winnipeg ground-runner, Cyril Coafee, who not only broke all Canadian records for the 100 yards' dash but equalled the world mark for this distance. It was at Winnipeg that Coafee negotiated the century run in 9.33 seconds and he startled the world by so doing. Coafee later ran at Toronto but was unable to do better than 10 seconds. To him perhaps more than anyone in Canada, save Belmont, the sculler, belongs the honor of bringing the sport spot-light on this country in 1922. Charlie Paddock, of California, feat of the great Morvich which is looked upon as the sprinting was unbeaten as a two-year-old, marvel of the age, although the Canadian, Coafee, equalled his record. Paddock, however, has been more consistent and was the first man to reach the 9 3-5 mark on man of baseball and for in that event. Golf Championships
 C. G. Fraser won the amateur golf championship of Canada last year. He is a Montrealer and the first one from that city to win the title for some years. Fraser and another Montreal player, Norman Scott, entered the finals for the coveted title, the former winning out after a match that took the two to an extra hole. The winner had the misfortune to follow a good deal of the way but he won out in spite of all.

In golf in 1922, Gene Sarazen was the outstanding figure from the masculine point of view; Glenna Collett from the feminine angle in the United States. Sarazen started out by winning the southern championship from a high class field and then followed up by taking the title at Skokie. This is regarded as the highest honor that American golf can bestow. Walter Hagen is next to Sarazen in golf and he won the British open championship.

Major League Baseball
 Major league baseball teams on the whole ran true to form. Critics picked the New York Giants to repeat their win of 1921 and they did. In the American League the Yankees finished first but they failed badly when approaching the wire in the world's series. Rogers Hornsby captured the home run honors with 42 circuit drives to his credit with Ken Williams second with 35 and Babe Ruth badly behind. George Sisler led in the American League with an average of .419. Walter Hoover, although he is not known as the official champion of Canada, is one of the outstanding scullers in the country today. He won the Diamond Sculls at Henley, England, last year.

Rugby and Soccer
 There is no doubt that the outstanding man in Canadian rugby in the past two years was Lionel Conacher of the Toronto Argonauts. He is known as the "big train" of the Canadian game and there was certainly nothing to stop him.

Princeton is the team of destiny. That one sentence sums up the big thrill of the football campaign in 1922 in the United States. Princeton, regarded by a majority of experts as inferior to Harvard and Yale and certain to be defeated by Chicago, won from all three.

In English rugby played in some parts of the Prairies but mostly on the Pacific Coast, Jack Tyrwhitt, of Vancouver, captain of the Centrals two years ago and

leader of the Native Sons last year, is the brainiest and flashiest player of the day.
