Delegate Sutherland Writes to Owners and Union Regarding Matter

PUBLICITY NECESSARY
 Effort Will be Made Again in 1925 to Kill Prince Rupert Fish Market

The Ketchikan Daily News, which has resumed publication after two or three months suspension, publishes a letter sent by Delegate Dan Sutherland to the Fishing Vessel Owners Association and also the Deep Sea Fishermen's Union at Seattle in part as follows:

Louis Hansen of Ketchikan, Alaska, has recently secured control of the printing plant of the Ketchikan News, a daily paper of that place, which suspended publication last September. I have for a long time believed that the interests of the Alaska fishermen should be presented to the public and to Congress through the medium of the press. The various interests in Alaska that are always struggling to exact tribute from the fishermen have newspaper organs with which to circulate their propaganda, and I found that while the so-called Point-dexter Amendment was pending in Congress, the press clippings from the organs of the interests carried considerable weight when read by members of Congress.

Municipal Election Proclamation 1923

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given to the Mayor of the Municipality of the City of Prince Rupert, and to require the presence of the said electors at the City Clerk's office, in the City Hall, City of Prince Rupert, on Monday the 14th day of January A.D. 1923, at 12 o'clock noon for the purpose of electing persons to represent them in the Municipal Council as Mayor and Aldermen.

The mode of nomination of Candidates shall be as follows:

The candidates shall be nominated in writing. The writing shall be subscribed by two voters of the Municipality, one voter of the said electors at the City Clerk's office, in the City Hall, City of Prince Rupert, on Monday the 14th day of January A.D. 1923, at 12 o'clock noon for the purpose of electing persons to represent them in the Municipal Council as Mayor and Aldermen.

Qualification for Candidates for Mayor
 The qualification for a candidate for Mayor shall be that the said candidate shall, save as otherwise provided in the Municipal Act, be a British subject of the full age of twenty-one years, who has been for the six months next preceding the date of nomination and is registered in the Land Registry Office as owner of land or land improvements within the City of Prince Rupert, or who is the holder of a lease or leasehold interest in land or land improvements within the City of Prince Rupert, or who is the holder of a lease or leasehold interest in land or land improvements within the City of Prince Rupert, or who is the holder of a lease or leasehold interest in land or land improvements within the City of Prince Rupert.

Qualification for Candidates for Aldermen

Election of Police Commissioner

Qualification for Commissioner of Police

School Trustees

McMeekin, whose terms expire in 1923, and the other to take the place of Dr. W. T. Kerrin, who has resigned. The three persons receiving the highest number of votes will be elected for a two year term, and the person receiving the lowest number of votes for one year. It will be necessary that nominations be handed to the Returning Officer at the time and place as in the case of Mayor and Aldermen provided by statute, as set out above, and also at the time of nomination each candidate make a declaration showing his qualification in the same manner as provided for Mayor and Aldermen.
