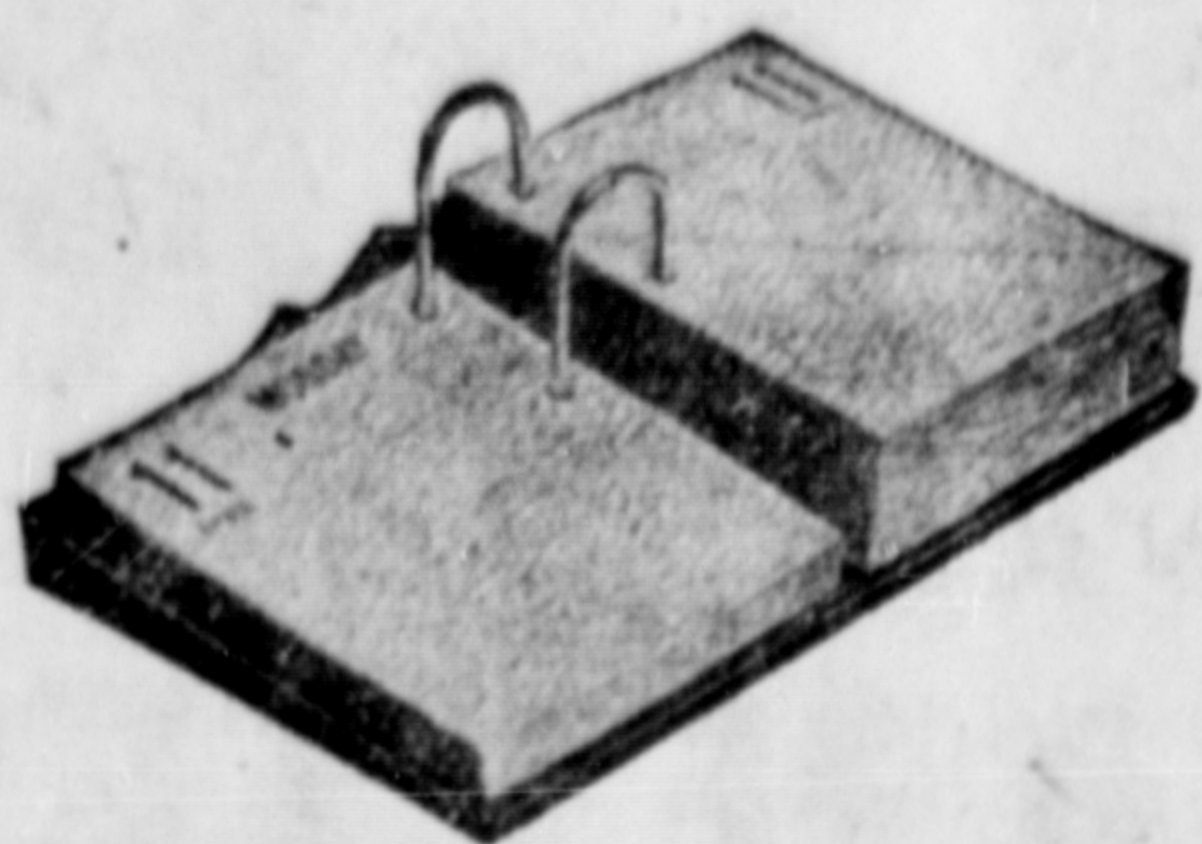

Take 2 eggs, beaten light; 1 cup sugar, beaten in the eggs; 1/2 teaspoon salt; nutmeg; 1/2 cup Pacific Milk; 1/2 cup of water; 1 teaspoon soda; 2 teaspoons cream of tartar; flour to roll, not hard. Cook in boiling lard or Crisco until brown.

SOLDIER PRE-EMPTION.

Editor, Daily News:

At the request of the Great War Veterans' Association, the provincial government and legislature have enacted a special measure called the Pre-Emption Free Grant Act, 1922, under which those returned pre-emptors who failed to get their Crown grants free under the old act which expired on August 31st, 1922, are given a new opportunity to do so, which opportunity will be open for six months, or until June 30, 1923.

If you were on your pre-emption and left it to go overseas, you are entitled to your crown grant without further duties, and to refund of any monies and taxes paid by you up to the time of getting the crown grant. If your pre-emption has been cancelled since the date on which the old act expired, there is a special provision for you getting it revived. You will not get these benefits unless you make application for them. Make application with as little delay as possible to your government agent, or to the G.W.V.A. to press your claim.

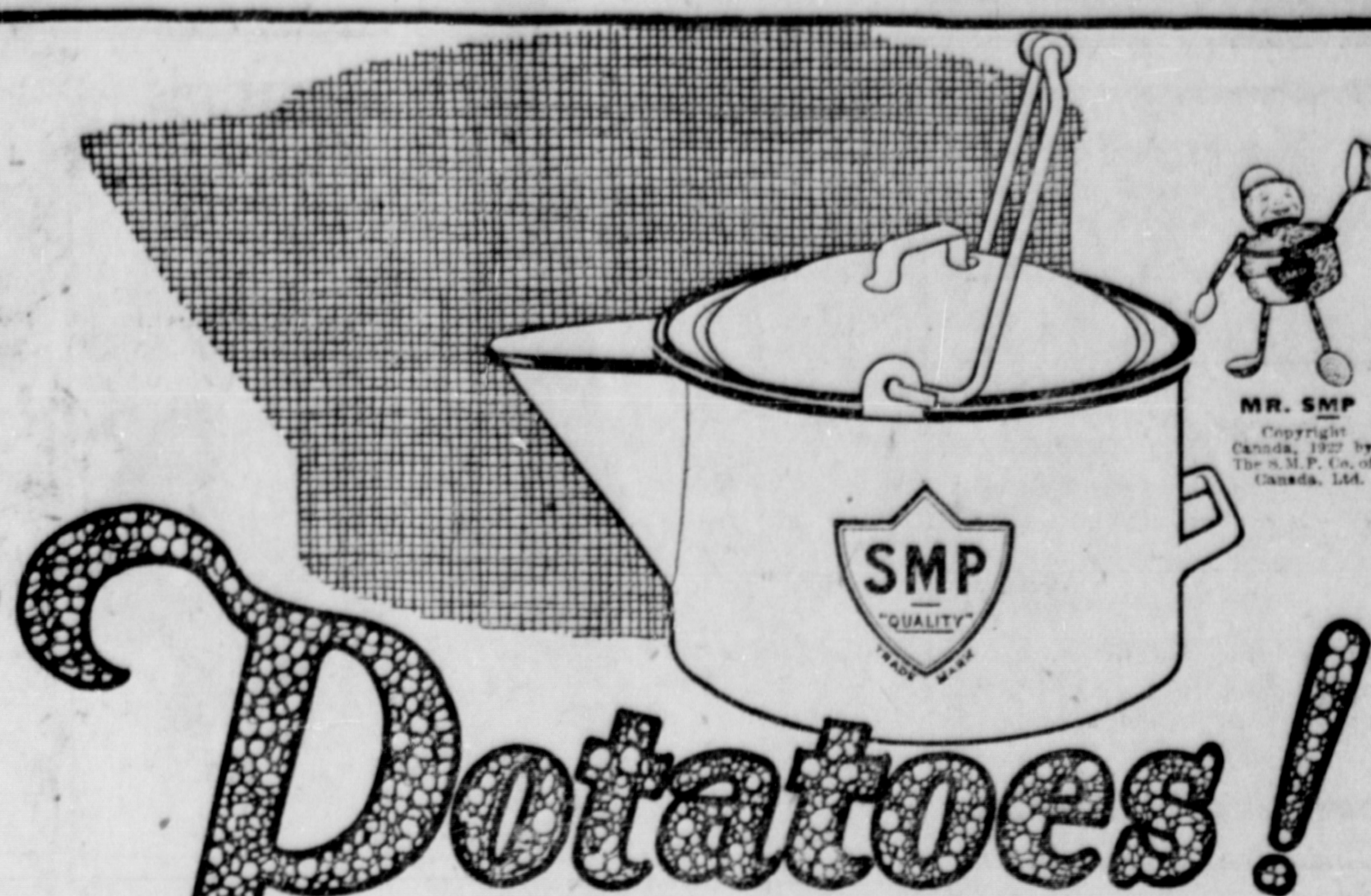
