GIANT SEAPLANE IS BEING CONSTRUCTED

ROME, Jan. 15.—A giant seaplane designed to carry 100 passengers, the largest yet constructed, is under way at the Caproni works here. The craft will be a triplane, with the engines, of which there will be eight, each of 400 horse-power, divided between the front and rear wing sections. It will be 98 feet in width, will have an overall length of 74 feet and will stand 31 feet high. The weight of the seaplane alone will exceed 13½ tons, and when fully loaded 25 tons. It will have a speed of 90 miles an hour with a range of 600 miles and will take about two years to complete.
