WORLD FAIR PLANS FOR PHILADELPHIA

PHILADELPHIA, Jan. 17.—The sesqui-centennial exhibition to be held here in 1926, and to be known as the "World Festival of Peace and Progress" will be one of the most ambitious world fairs held in the United States, according to plans which have just been made public by the Fair Association.

The exhibition will open the end of April, 1926, and close November of the same year. The Fair Association's advisory executive committee estimates the cost of the exhibition to the association will be \$15,000,000. The purpose of the fair is announced to be "to portray the progress of the world particularly in the 50 years since the centennial exhibition held in Philadelphia in 1876" and "to create a closer understanding and foster the goodwill of the peoples of the world."
