Municipal Election Proclamation 1923

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given to the electors of the Municipality of the City of Prince Rupert, that I require the presence of the said electors at the City Clerk's office, in the City Hall, City of Prince Rupert, on Monday the 21st day of January A.D. 1923, at 12 o'clock noon for the purpose of electing persons to represent them in the Municipal Council as Mayor and Aldermen.

The mode of nomination of Candidates shall be as follows: The candidates shall be nominated in writing, the writing shall be signed by two voters of the Municipality as provided in the Municipal Act, and shall be delivered to the Returning Officer at the City Clerk's office, in the City Hall, City of Prince Rupert, on Monday the 21st day of January A.D. 1923, at 12 o'clock noon for the purpose of electing persons to represent them in the Municipal Council as Mayor and Aldermen.

Qualification for Candidates for Mayor. The qualification for a candidate for Mayor is that the said candidate shall, save as otherwise provided in the Municipal Act, be a British subject of the full age of twenty-one years, who has resided in the City of Prince Rupert for a period of six months next preceding the date of the Municipal Election, and is registered in the Land and Improvement Office as owner of land or land value, as assessed on the last assessment and above all registered judgments, mortgages and other encumbrances, and has paid the sum of one hundred dollars or more upon the principal of the purchase price under such agreement to purchase.

Qualification for Candidates for Aldermen. The qualification for a candidate for Alderman is that the said candidate shall, save as otherwise provided in the Municipal Act, be a British subject of the full age of twenty-one years, who has been for a period of six months next preceding the date of the Municipal Election, and is registered in the Land and Improvement Office as owner of land or land value, as assessed on the last assessment and above all registered judgments, mortgages and other encumbrances, and has paid the sum of one hundred dollars or more upon the principal of the purchase price under such agreement to purchase.

Election of Police Commissioner. AND FURTHER TAKE NOTICE that I require the presence of the Electors at the City Clerk's office, in the City Hall, City of Prince Rupert, on Monday the 21st day of January A.D. 1923, at 12 o'clock noon for the purpose of electing one person who shall act as Police Commissioner for two years, to take the place of T. B. Macdonald, whose term expires on 31st December 1922.

Qualification for School Trustees. I am notified by the Secretary of the school Board that it will be necessary to hold an election for four persons, three of whom are to take the places of Messrs. F. W. Johnson, J. W. Patmore and T. V. McEwen, whose terms expire on 31st December 1922, the other to take the place of Dr. W. T. Kerr, who has resigned. The three persons receiving the highest number of votes will be elected for a two year term, the person receiving the lowest number of votes will be elected for one year. It is necessary that nominations be handed to the Returning Officer at the time and place provided by statute, as set out above, and that the mode of nomination shall be as provided in the Municipal Act, and that the mode of nomination shall be as provided in the Municipal Act.

Qualification for School Trustees. In the City School District of the first, second and third class, any person being a British subject of the full age of 21 years, actually residing within the city and having been for the six months next preceding the date of nomination, the registered owner in the Land Registry Office of land or land value, as assessed on the last Municipal Assessment Roll of 1921, or more, and above all registered judgments or mortgages, and being otherwise qualified to vote at an election of School Trustees in the said School District, shall be eligible to be elected or to serve as a School Trustee in such City School District.
