DR. SUN YAT SET SAYS ASIA FOR ASIATICS

Declares Japan Should Have Joined With Germany in Cage War

SHANGHAI, Jan. 12.—"Asia for the Asiatics" is the new slogan of Dr. Sun Yat Sen, former head of the Canton government, who is now urging an alliance between Japan and Russia.

In an interview published in the Jiji, Dr. Sun declares Japan lost a golden opportunity to preserve Asia for the Asiatics when she disregarded his advice to join with the Teutonic powers.

"Japan participated in the war on the side of the allied countries," he declared, "with the result that realization of the Pan-Asiatic plan had been delayed indefinitely. As Japan has shown herself incapable of seizing this opportunity, it will be China that will be called upon to make Asia a place for Asiatics in the future."

"It is not too late for Japan to undo what she did blindly during the war. If Japan really wishes to see Asia controlled by the Asiatics, she must promote relations with the Russians. She must make common cause with the Russians in opposing the aggression of the Anglo-Saxons."
