**DEMSEY RETAINS TITLE  
THOUGH GIBBONS GIVES  
HIM GAME FIGHT UNTIL  
FIFTEEN ROUNDS.**

bons who appeared less strong than the champion at close quarters. Dempsey tossed Gibbons around the ring like a featherweight. They were clinched at the bell.

Round 2.—Both missed and Dempsey prepared to fight close in getting over blows in clinches at which crowd protested. Dempsey landed body blows and Gibbons countered. Then head blows were given and returned. Crowd again protested at Dempsey's low round.

Round 3.—Dempsey landed and they clinched. Jaw blows were exchanged and Dempsey then fought exclusively for the body. Round 4.—Several misses and then they fought close in pounding each other. Gibbons getting severe body punishment. Dempsey got over a hard right over the heart which did not seem to slow up the challenger. Gibbons bored and Dempsey had trouble with him.

**Gibson's Round**

Round 5.—More close fighting. Gibbons knocked Dempsey to the ropes with left to jaw and crowd jumped to feet yelling. Gibbons landed another to the jaw and the crowd went hysterical. Dempsey refused to lead and sought close quarters. Both fighters missed and landed.

Round 6.—Gibbons was boxing beautifully and seemed to gain confidence with every round. Dempsey knocked Gibbons between the ropes with hard right to jaw as they were coming out of clinch. Gibbons claimed a foul and the crowd hissed Dempsey. Gibbons missed left hook and caught Dempsey backhanded and apologized. Champion smiled. Dempsey landed hard right hook to jaw which hurt Gibbons.

Round 7.—Dempsey continued close fighting with short jabs while holding with one hand. Gibbons got over hard one and Dempsey returned hard right to body and hit Gibbons twice distinctly below belt but referee said nothing.

Round 8.—Dempsey hit low again and crowd commenced to make threats. Both landed hard blows with missing and clinching.

Round 9.—Gibbons landed two hard rights and lefts to jaw and crowd hopped to its feet again.


