One Hundred People Located at Hanall East of Terrace

MILL IS UP TO DATE

Japanese Market Being Supplied With Hemlock Squares; Looking to California

Though one of the latest established in Prince Rupert district, the sawmill of the Royal Lumber Co. at Hanall, 110 1/2 miles east of Prince Rupert on the Canadian National Railway, is one of the most steadily operated. It is owned by Olof Hanson, the prominent timber operator of the central interior, and B. E. Allen, formerly district forester, is the manager. Its daily capacity at single shift is about 20,000 feet. At the present time it is cutting principally for export to Japan, 200,000 feet going forward monthly in the form of "baby squares" and boards of hemlock and spruce. A similar quantity of dimension and finished lumber is being piled in the yards for other markets.

The Royal Lumber Co. was formed in 1919 when Mr. Allen left the service of the forest branch to assume the management. Clearing of the mill site commenced in October of that year and the first lumber was cut in December. The mill has been running pretty well continuously ever since and there has been no cessation of cutting since last November.

Spruce Market

Until June of this year, the United States spruce market was good and this lumber was shipped steadily by rail to New York, Chicago and other Eastern points. When this market fell off about midsummer, the plant started producing for export to Japan through the H. R. McMillan Export Co. In spite of substantial shipments made, the mill yard now contains 1,250,000 feet of dimension and finished lumber.

Now that the C.G.M.M. California steamers are to make regular calls at Prince Rupert for cargo, the Royal Mill management hopes to work up export of dimension hemlock to California, negotiations for this business being already under way. Once western hemlock is introduced in California, it is confidently felt that a steady market will have been established. The equipment of the Royal Mill is such that any order for finished lumber can be filled.

An Up-to-date Camp

The camp of the Royal Mill is modern and up-to-date, the accommodation for the men having been adjudged two years ago by Dr. E. C. Arthur, provincial health officer, to be equal to anything in any part of the province. There is a general store, post office, school and several residences for the accommodation of families. There are ten families at Hanall, fifteen children attend the school and the total population is about 100 people.

tion is about 100 people. The mill and camp is situated within a few feet of the railway track and all trains stop there. A short spur has been built into the loading platforms of the mill.

Logging to date has been conducted very close to the mill and the company has extensive limits close at hand to draw from. These contain some 15,000,000, or 20,000,000 feet of timber and will constitute a sufficient supply for a number of years on the present scale of operation. Before long, however, the railway may have to be utilized for the hauling of logs from limits the company holds at Pitman and Pacific.

With Mr. Allen as manager, Jack Edwards, formerly of Prince Rupert, who is storekeeper and assistant postmaster, and E. Fossberg, accountant, are associated in the management of Royal Mills.
