

## VISCOUNT GREY AND DEMOCRACY

### System Run Down Blood Out of Order

In the Remedy for Present  
His Declares Famous  
Statesman

LONDON, March 7.—Viscount Grey of Fallodon delivered the Grey of Fallodon Lecture at Armstrong College, Newcastle, and said that when he looked back he reflected that politics were much more simple than now. The dominating question then was the franchise, which was then as the complete statement of representative government based on the house of suffrage. The issue was simple. There was then no distinction between Liberals and Labor.

In some countries democratic government was not regarded as an ideal at all. He did not take what had happened in Russia as an instance, because Russia had not democratic representation, and, therefore, having had a trial, it could not be said to have been superseded. But what was happening in Italy was significant, had a democratic element, but quite recently it was superseded by something, no doubt, must have popular support behind it, which was based not on party election, but on organized force. For some time, it was that system of government which was regarded as ideal in Italy.

#### May Go Down

It is possible, under the conditions of chaos in Europe, that a representative government might go down for a number of other systems, under the stress of circumstances. One heard of many people who questioned democratic representative government in a way in which it was never questioned before. Personally, I was attached to democratic representative government as he ever been. He considered the guarantee of democratic representative government in this way was that the government elected by the popular vote, was dependent, day by day, on parliament was sitting, on confidence of the representatives of the people.

Much of the shortcoming of democratic government, he said, was due to the fact that public opinion was not necessarily statesmanlike. The most important question at the moment was relations between Capital and Labor. He thought that the majority of people, while they were impressed with the view

#### Labor's Claims
