John Willman, president of the Kleauza Co., Ltd., left for U.S. on Saturday night's train after spending a few days in the city on company business.

R. B. Skinner, of Anyox, has accepted the appointment as a city fireman at a salary of \$150 per month. He will succeed George B. Casey on June 1.

Fred Jondry left on Saturday night's train for Campbellton, New Brunswick, to visit his father who is ill. He expects to return to the city within two or three months.

The C.P.R. steamer Princess Beatrice, Capt. C. C. Saintey, arrived from Vancouver and wayports at 1 o'clock yesterday afternoon and cleared again for the south at 3.

The city council will receive a report from the Board of Works tonight recommending that 2,400 feet of wood pipe and fittings be purchased from the Canadian Pipe Co., of Vancouver.

Inspector Adland left on the train on Saturday night and will go as far east as Prince George on a tour of inspection in connection with the activities of the Royal Canadian Mounted police.

Five applications have so far been received for the city treasurership. The appointment will be dealt with by the city council next Monday night, the date for the receiving of applications closing then.

G. C. Paine, M.D., C.M., of Telkwa has been appointed medical health officer and medical inspector of schools for the Telkwa and surrounding district, including Round Lake, Deep Creek and Woodmere.

Thirty tons of coal will be purchased by the city from Albert & McCaffery at \$12.75 a ton for use in the city hall. A report to this effect will be submitted by the finance committee to the city council tonight.

The sermon at the evening service in the Methodist Church yesterday took the form of an exhibition of magic lantern pictures of Christ's ministry. Rev. G. G. Haeker read accounts from the Gospel telling of each scene.

The Union steamer Chelohsin, Capt. Stacey, arrived at 11:45 last night from Vancouver and wayports and sailed shortly afterwards for Anyox, Alice Arm and the Nass and Skeena Rivers. The vessel is to sail from here for the south at 6 o'clock tomorrow evening.

The Board of Works has reported for the city council tonight recommending the completion of the laying of a 6 inch water main to the Canadian Fish & Cold Storage Co.'s plant at Seal Cove and the putting in of a hydrant at a cost of \$22. The piping has been bought and part of the trenching has been completed.

On Saturday Archbishop Du Verney confirmed two Japanese women. These candidates were presented by Z. Higashi, the Japanese missionary. The address in Japanese was given by Miss Cox, an English lady, who has worked as a C.M.S. missionary in Japan for twenty-two years, and is returning there next month.
