Holding conferences tends to bring nations together and help them to straighten out their difficulties and lessen their differences, perhaps, but they do not mean much more. The face that a conference is held and decisions arrived at never proves signs of the continuance of the others and gives his opinion that final unless international public opinion is affected thereby.

In the British parliament, Ramsay Macdonald, the labor leader, asked that Britain call a disarmament conference. Yet it seems but the other day that the delegates of the nations were meeting in Washington to discuss international disarmament and the limitation thereof. A good deal was accomplished at that conference but after all it is too early to judge results. It is only if the conference was effective in preserving peace over a period of time and at the same time of diverting money and effort from war measures to peace measures that it may be looked upon as a success.

Let Us Organize And Hold Meeting.

"Let us organize and hold a meeting" is the motto of the day. People work in groups, in organizations, in societies, or in lodges. Other mottoes of the day are "get together," "work together," "act together," "play together." "In union there is strength." Yet the power of organization is often over estimated and individual effort minimized. Very often the strength of an organization is only measured by the influence of the leader.
