WASHINGTON, Aug. 28 .- Exraordinary precautions for the safeguarding of their supplies of alcohol are taken by the various departments of the government which use this commodity, now so much in demand for the making of what in the parlance of the bootlegger is styled "sympathetic" intoxicants.

Officials of the departments and bureaus declare the systems they have installed have operated so successfully that the losses have been negligible, confined to the heft of a pint here and a quart there. And so close is the check they assert, that frequently even these small peculations are traced and the offenders dismissed.


