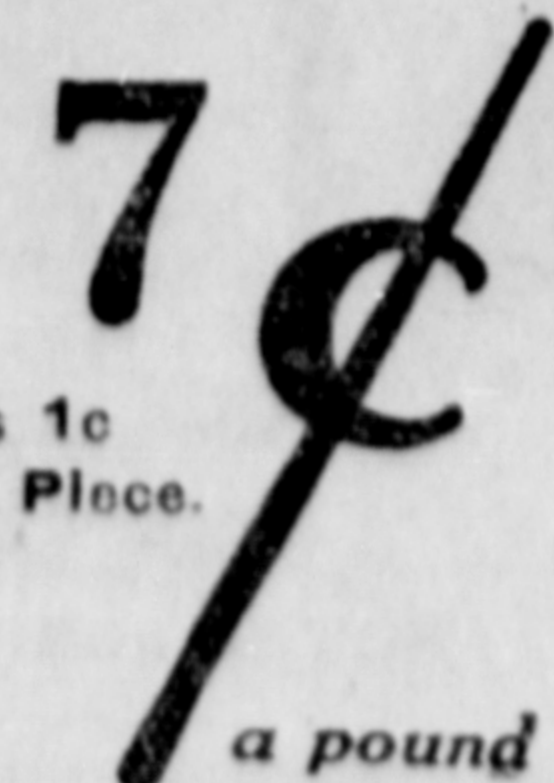
WONDERS WHY MANY MORE TOURISTS DO NOT COME THIS WAY

Geo. McAfee, manager of the Georgetown sawmill, arrived in the city last night on a business visit and returned this morning by launch.

Jarvis McLeod, collector of customs, who has been to Alaska on departmental business, is expected back on the Princess Mary today.

Dr. Carson, of Stewart, left on the eastbound train last night for Winnipeg to be married. He will return to Stewart with his bride in a few weeks time.

The application of the Dominion Club for a license is being held by the city council for further consideration. A report from the finance committee to this effect was adopted at last night's council meeting.

The city treasurer was authorized by the city council last night to write to various bond-holders offering them Hays Creek bridge and Booth School reconstruction debentures, bids to close on June 23. The matter of advertising was suggested but it was deemed better results would be obtained by communicating direct.

V. Basso-Bert, of this city, who is visiting with his family in Italy, has sent a postcard to the editor of the Daily News from Rome in which he tells of the visit paid to the Eternal City recently by King George V. and Queen. "Their Majesties were given a magnificent reception and it was a glorious day," Mr. Basso-Bert says.

A change in the Canadian National coastwise steamship schedule to the Queen Charlotte Island will go into effect tomorrow. The Prince Albert, leaving at 8 p.m., and will take over the regular run of the Prince John this trip. The Prince John will leave here in the future every second Wednesday instead of every second Saturday.

A by-law providing five years' exemption for the Great War Veterans' Association from taxation on its property will be presented to the ratepayers at the first opportunity. Such action was decided upon by the city council last night on recommendation of the Finance committee in dealing with the request of the Association to this end.

Malcolm McLeod, who has the contract for the repairing of city plank roads, has also undertaken to deliver lumber for the work at \$1.50 and \$1.75 per thousand. This will eliminate the necessity of using the city's Day-Elder truck for the purpose. It was decided at last night's council meeting to have Mr. McLeod start his own deliveries at once. The statement was made that it cost the city \$4 or \$5 a thousand to make deliveries itself.

The application of Mrs. J. M. Collison for remuneration in the sum of \$10 for materials supplied in making repairs to Brian Street, Section 8, was further considered by the city council last night. The Board of Works recommend that the \$10 be paid but an amendment was put forward by Ald. Stephens and Ald. Collart to lay the matter over for a week pending a report from the city engineer. The amendment carried, Ald. Perry, Ald. Munro and Ald. Macdonald voting against it.
