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CANADA DOCKS AT MONTREAL

Many Prominent Passengers
Reach Canada on White
Star-Dominion Boat

MONTREAL, Que., May 29. — Concluding a quick voyage from Liverpool and having experienced pleasant weather during the entire trip with the exception of a few hours fog in the lower gulf, the White Star-Dominion liner "Canada" docked at Montreal at 7:30 this morning.

Capt. R. J. Smith, the ship's commander, reported smooth seas all the way across the Atlantic in direct contrast with the stormy trip the ship made last month when she was directed to Halifax on account of unfavorable weather in the gulf.

The Canada disembarked a number of well-known Canadians including a number from Prince Rupert and vicinity.

Hospital Man Aboard

Among those arriving on the Canada was A. G. Fotheringham-Lyson, who for the past three years has been appeal secretary to Lord Lansdale, treasurer of Charing-Cross Hospital, London. Mr. Fotheringham-Lyson has been prominently connected with the hospital for many years and, on the occasion of Mrs. Sarah Bernhardt's farewell performance at the London Coliseum in 1913, when she gave her services for the benefit of the hospital, he was presented to their Majesties the King and Queen who were attending the performance. Mr. Fotheringham-Lyson is secretary of the Practical Physiological Club, of London, founded by Anne Maude Hallam, the well-known psychologist who has founded many psychology clubs in America and is now continuing her work in England.

Commenting on the recent political changes in England, Mr. Fotheringham-Lyson stated that Premier Stanley Baldwin was undoubtedly a strong man and what was more "Was a favorite with the crowd." He had gathered a good cabinet around him, stated Mr. Fotheringham-Lyson, and those at home were looking for a steady improvement all around.

Veteran Captain

Also arriving by the Canada was Capt. Thomas, veteran commander of the White Star and Leyland line steamers. Capt. Thomas paid high tribute to the Canada and, although he has spent fifty-two years of his life continuously at sea, stated that the Canada was the best disciplined ship he had yet travelled on.

Capt. Thomas was the skipper on the Leyland line passenger steamer Gestrin for 19 years until she was torpedoed in 1917, with one thousand imperial troops on board, off the Isle of Skye, in the Aegean Sea, en route to Palestine, when not a single life was lost. Capt. Thomas entered the transport service in August, 1914, with the Gestrin, and was continually at sea until the armistice. During the war he was on several occasions at Montreal and Quebec, both on the Parisian and Bohemian conveying troops to and from Europe. Although he transported more than 95,000 soldiers, he has the record of never having lost a single life. Capt. Thomas is on his way to Peace River, Alberta, to join his daughter who came out on the Canada last year and was recently married.

Waifs and Strays

Among the 267 third class passengers which the Canada landed at Quebec was a party of 47 boys between the ages of 13 and 16 years from the London Waifs' and Strays' Home who are en route to Sherbrooke, Quebec, under the personal direction of Jos. Frost.

The new purser of the Canada is Eugene Grahl. Mr. Grahl is one of the old White Star Dominion line pursers and while this is his first trip to Montreal he saw considerable service in transport service to Halifax during the war.

Other passengers arriving by the Canada were L. Balogh, of Budapest, who is on his way to Toronto Cathedral and Dr. W. G. Powell and family of Toronto. Dr. Powell, for the last three years, has filled the position of chief surgeon at Manchester hospital.

ENGINEER MINE IS AGAIN IN LAWSUIT

Nephews of Late Mrs. Alexander
Claim They Are Entitled to
Share in Property

VANCOUVER, May 29. — Once again the famous Engineer Gold Mine of Atlin is the subject of litigation.

Robert E. Williams, of Milwaukee, and Horace K. Williams, of Los Angeles, nephews of the late Mrs. James Alexander, who with her husband was drowned in October, 1918, are the plaintiffs in a suit begun against J. A. Fraser, administrator of the late Captain Alexander's estate.

They claim that as heirs at law as next of kin of Mrs. Alexander they are entitled to share in the distribution of the estate, including the Engineer Mine which has been estimated to be worth millions of dollars.

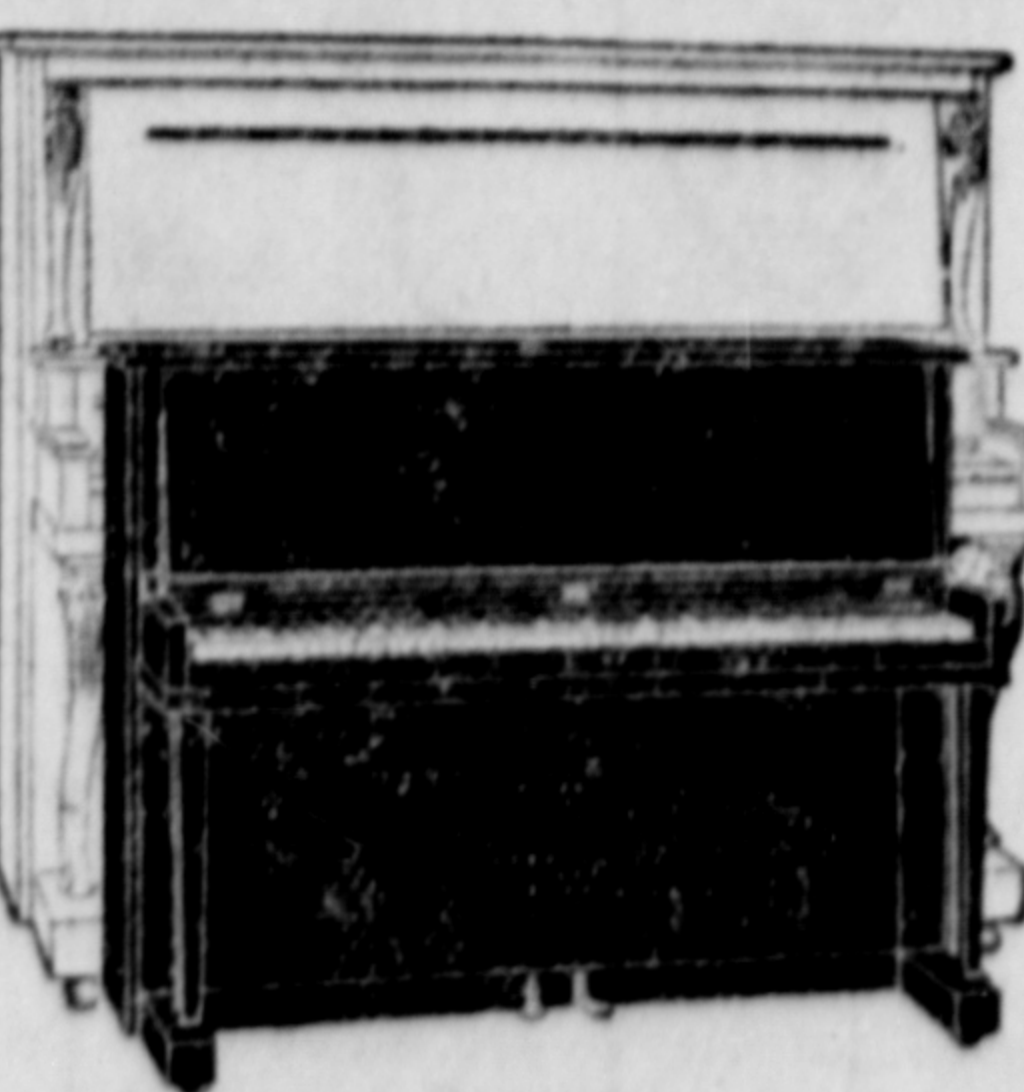
MAN GOT AWAY FROM HOSPITAL

Provincial Police Prisoner Escaped Last Night But Rounded Up Today

A. Roseng, who was brought from Stewart on Sunday night by Provincial Constable Martin to do a six month's term of imprisonment at the Okalla prison farm on a charge of vagrancy and who had been taken to the hospital here for medical attention to his arm, escaped from the hospital at 11:30 last night in his night attire. He was captured shortly after noon today by city constable Alex. McDonald on Ninth Avenue West.

The prisoner went into the lavatory at the hospital and, locking the door inside, made his escape through the window dropping some fifteen feet to the ground. The provincial and city police, upon receiving notification of the escape, made a hunt for the prisoner all night and up to the time of his capture today. The prisoner had been hiding in the bush all night in his hospital garments with only a pair of slippers on his feet. This morning he was chased out of a basement on Ninth Ave. West, and it was from this information that Constable McDonald got on his track.
