Says Conditions Prevailing There Are Scandalous: Kissing on Benches

LONDON, Sept. 24.— London society is considerably stirred by the statement of the Bishop of London that the conditions prevailing in our parks and open spaces is scandalous. His Grace himself has not conducted a personal investigation, but certain counsel for the promotion of public morality has employed men of great experience to "observe." These men state that they have seen many cases of impropriety. The Chief of the Office of Works, however, says that officials of his department visit Hyde Park night after night but never see anything more shocking than two young people kissing each other behind a bush. It was George Gissing who observed that the streets were the drawing room of the poor, in which case we may regard Hyde Park as their parlor.

It is rumored that the Bishop desires an alteration in the by-laws which govern parks and open spaces, and intends to ask that Hyde Park may be closed at an earlier hour, while the army of overseers shall be increased. The point is likely to be raised in the House at the next session.

BARNESLEY WINS RECEIVING SET

Wireless Apparatus was Offered to First Amateur Getting Messages Through to Greenland

FIRST NEWS OF FIGHT

Jack Barnesley is the winner of a fine radio receiving apparatus as a reward for being the first man to communicate with the McMillan expedition at Refuge Bay on the coast of north Greenland. Owing to the fact that Operator Mix of the Bedowin was unable to get any message out, the Chicago Radio Laboratories, which installed the wireless apparatus aboard the ship, offered a prize to the first amateur station communicating with the expedition. Mr. Barnesley was the first and Operator Mix has wireless a message to the Chicago firm stating that fact. Mr. Barnesley has also put in his claim for the set.

Mr. Barnesley still continues to communicate with the Bedowin. He took from Operator Mix a list of several hundred stations, whose signals he had been able to hear, but with whom he had been unable to communicate.
