**STORES WILL NOT CLOSE ON MONDAY**

Retail Merchants Decided Last Night—Steps Towards Organizing

At a meeting of the retail merchants, held in the city police court last night it was decided that all stores will keep open for business on Monday, the King's birthday. A consultation was held this morning between the city solicitor and representatives of the retail merchants. The city solicitor ruled that, although Monday is a legal holiday for schools, banks and civil servants so far as other people are concerned, it is optional and there is no penalty for its violation.

It was also decided by the retail merchants to hold a meeting next Friday night when a full representation of the local merchants will be asked for with a view to reorganizing the Retail Merchants Association. If the association is reorganized it will not be upon an elaborate scale. The dues will be nominal and there will be practically no expense in connection with the membership. It will be simply an organization to deal with problems as they arise and particularly to deal with the matter of public holidays.
