#### MRS. ROBERSON'S VIEWS

Editor, Daily News:

It was with the greatest regret that I read in the Daily News that the new city council had not re-instated three of Prince Rupert's greatest assets in Mr. T. C. Duncan, superintendent of utilities; Mr. E. A. Woods, city clerk; and Mr. Vance, city treasurer. The results of the election showed the feelings of the people on the unjust act of the late city council, but apparently, although they pay the taxes, their opinion is not of much consequence.

Why were they dismissed? Was it through ignorance or personal spite? It was certainly not in the interests of economy! We cannot afford to lose the services of these such excellent public servants! Once before, if my memory is not playing me tricks, we let Mr. Duncan go, and his successor presented the city with a thirty-two thousand dollar deficit! Mr. Duncan, I think, was asked to come back, and not only wiped out that deficit but each year has provided the wherewithal to carry on the utilities, and given quite a sum from the same source to the council to spend on other work for the city.

Mr. Duncan's fellow workers showed how much they appreciated their head "who could not be bought," and the rest of the people, though they did their best to show their feelings on the subject at the election, were horrified by the new council fixing the seal to the act of injustice committed by their predecessors!

### Sport Chat

Not only are the present New York Giants two times world's baseball champions but McGraw's powerful Manhattan Club also is the life time champion of the National League. Despite years of second division ball during the Friseman regime, the Giants had the highest percentage of any team in the National League. Over a span of forty seasons, the Giants won 2,692 games and lost 2,089 while they held a winning margin over every team in the League.

It was forty years ago when the New York Nationals played their first championship game on Manhattan soil. This was on May 1, 1883, the strong Boston being New York's opponents. It was fitting that the Giants should start off with a victory, as they won the game from the "Red Stockings" by a score of 7 to 5. A crowd estimated at over 15,000 saw the game among them being General U.S. Grant, who "pulled" continuously at a long black cigar and applauded generously whenever the occasion demanded. So great was the crowd that some of the players sold their stocks to standees for fifty cents. There were no 815,000 a year players in those days.

The New York team played its first game under McGraw's management on July 19, 1902. Philadelphia was New York's opponent and won by the score of 5 to 3. McGraw played shortstop for the Giants, handled three chances cleanly, and made one hit and scored a run. McGinnity and Bowerman were New York's battery, while "Ham" Berg and Charley Doan attended to Philadelphia's pitching and catching. Hughie Jennings, at present assistant manager of the Giants, played first base and captained the Phillies.

The greatest number of victories that the Giants have taken from any team in one season is twenty, the Boston team of 1904 being the victim. Three teams have taken as many as sixteen victories from the Giants in one season—the Pittsburgh team of 1901, the Boston team of 1902 and the Chicago team of 1907.
