COLORED WOMAN DIED ON EIGHTH AVENUE

Amanda Bolden Had Been Suffering From Stomach Trouble—Came Here From Victoria

Amanda Bolden, colored, aged 45, died last night at 841 Eighth Avenue West. The death was reported to the city police at 12.05 midnight by Dr. L. W. Kergin who was called to attend the woman. Acting Constable D. S. Cameron proceeded to the scene and had the body removed to Hayner Bros. undertaking parlors.

A post mortem examination was made this afternoon by Dr. J. P. Cade establishing that death was due to natural causes. A friend of deceased, who dined with her last night, reported that she had been complaining of her stomach. He went out later and returning about midnight found her dead with a crowd of neighbors around. Deceased was known to have had stomach complaint previously. She came to the city about eighteen months ago from Victoria.
