Court of Revision in Session Anain this Morning Hears Waterfront Cases

The Canadian Fish & Cold Storage Co. Ltd. represented by W. Nicholls and W. E. Fisher, rested. made appeal against the assessment, of its property at Seal Cove at the court of revision this morning. Protests were entered at the valuation set on its waterfront charged against it.
