When a mountainous sea swept the decks of the steam halibut boat Andrew Kelly Thursday morning it swept overboard the mate, Jack Robins who was lost, cleaned gear and everything else off the decks, smashed in the skylights and the cabin windows and for a short time it seemed as if the staunch little craft must go under. However, the crew got busy and repaired the steering gear which had gone wrong, shifted the coal back into place and made her shipshape so that she rode out the storm and arrived home Sunday morning at nine o'clock.
