TALKED-OF FILM HERE

be carried until the end of the year. This having now been refused, the council had felt that the Bank of Montreal might possibly help. Therefore, the council had taken the chance and changed.

Defends Royal Bank

Ald. Casey was not entirely in accord with the explanation which had been given by Ald. Macdonald. As he (Ald. Casey) understood it,

the city had not got what it had expected from the Royal Bank and, as a matter of policy, had switched over. Personally, he had not been desirous of switching as there was no guarantee that the other bank would take care of the city either this year or next. The Royal Bank had said that it would like to wait and see how the city was to be carried on next year—whether or not a policy should be continued of spending more than the city was capable of collecting. He thought

that that was a fair and business-like attitude. The city had either to raise money or spend less. He only hoped that the other bank would assume its obligation to the city and take care of the finances as required, providing the city showed sane discretion in the disposition of its business. Ald. Casey explained that he had made this explanation in defence of the Royal Bank which he did not think was as bad as some people had made it out to be.
