ST. LOUIS, Sept. 22 .- One of the most daring robberies of modern times was carried out successfully here yesterday. whiskey cleanup from a local distillery was made, the value of the loot running close to two million dollars.

The thieves first made away with 893 barrels of whiskey, telephone receivers in Dawson valued at \$1,800,000, from the distillery. All attention was given to the recovery of this vast haul and while the police were busy on it the thieves seem to have returned to the distillery and York.
