### Belgium Submits New Plan to Great Britain With View to Settlement of Reparations

Continue Resistance

PARIS, Aug. 9 - The Belgian government has decided to take the initiative and directly approach Great Britain and France if reparations negotiations among the Allies show no signs of being resumed soon says a Brussells despatch.

Belgium will propose that reparations from Germany so far as France and Belgium are concerned be confined to the material damage suffered by those countries and that Great Britain cancel inter-Allied debts receiving from Germany the amount that she owes the United States. On this basis, the Belgian ministers will suggest that inter-Allied 'pour parlers' be started to settle the guarantee required from Germany.

#### Pack of Salmon on Skeena is 87,000 Cases to Date According to Chief Inspector of Fisheries Up to the present approximately 87,000 cases of salmon

have been packed on the Skeena River, according to Major Motherwell, chief inspector of fisheries, who has just completed a tour of the district. He says that generally speaking the run of sockeye in District Number 2 this season has been extremely satisfactory and indications seem to warrant the expectation that good packs of the fall varieties would also be made. His review in detail says:
