## CONVICTED OF

Twenty-Seven Members of One Big Union go to Jail at Los Angeles

LOS ANGELES, July 12 .- Convicted of criminal syndicalism, 27 alleged members of the Industrial Workers of the World were sentenced to serve penitentiary terms from one to fourteen years.

After the jury had found them guilty each was asked by the judge to give up his allegiance to the One Big Union principles in the prospect of clemency. Each emphatically refused and elected to be sentenced at once in the presence of the jury that had convicted them, but the jury filed out immediately after the judge had given them leave and sentence of the prisoners came aflerwards.

### KING REPLIES LABOR MESSAGE

Will Submit Matter of Royal Commission to Cabinet But Not Call Parliament

OTTAWA, July 12, - Right Hon. W. L. Mackenzie King has replied to the Trades and Labor Executive that he will be pleased to discuss with the cabinet the proposal to appoint a Royal Commission to probe conditions leading up to the strike in Nova Scotia but he personally doubts the necessity for such a commission. As for the calling of a special session of Parliament to discuss the calling out of the militia, he draws attention to the fact that the Militia Act covers the present emergency and the matter is not one for consideration by Parliament.

The first three carloads of hemlock lumber for the shipment of 500,000 feet that is to be sent from here to Japan on the C.G.M.M. Canadian Highlander, which will be here to load on July 22, arrived from the interior mills by last night's freight train. ## Carelessness Resulted in Catastrophe Early Today Near Kitkatla

John Brown, sixteen-year old son of Joshua Brown, of Kitkatla, was burned to death and his father, Joshua Brown, and Willie Jackson, all natives, were badly injured early this morning off Kitkatla when the gasoline boat, Kyuquot, in which they were fishing for salmon, was destroyed as a result of a gasoline explosion. News of the tragedy reached the city today on the gasboat Dorreen II., Capt. John Nelson, which brought the two injured men to the hospital here. It appears that the gasoline feed pipe on the ill-fated craft
