DOMESTIC SERVANTS ARE ARRIVING AND PLACED IN TORONTO

TORONTO, Nov. 23. — The Employment Service of Canada finds that in Ontario the problem of household help is slightly nearer a satisfactory solution, owing to the fact that there were 1,032 new arrivals from Great Britain during the year, all of whom have been placed. In the previous year the number stood at 262. Better attention is being given the comfort of domestics and they are not often allowed to be lonesome. An interesting development recently has been the large number of women in the casual section whom the Bureau has been unable to place, owing to the light demand.
