HOSPITAL NEEDS NEW LINOLEUM

Unable to get it From Old Building, Purchase May Now Be Necessary

At the meeting of the Hospital board last night, the question of new linoleum for the floors of two public wards in the hospital was discussed.

S. K. Campbell, chairman of the house committee, stated that an endeavor had been made to obtain the linoleum in the recently vacated Kelly-Douglas building which had not been found possible. The question of getting linoleum from the old court house had then been taken up by him with the Hon. T. D. Pattullo, minister of lands, Victoria, who had instructed the government agent to turn it over. However, the government agent had had other applicants for the building and also the linoleum therein. Mr. Pattullo had since written him to the effect that under the circumstances it would be impossible to turn the linoleum in the old court house over to the hospital. Mr. Campbell explained that it might be necessary to purchase new linoleum. After discussion the matter was left in the hands of the house committee for further report.
