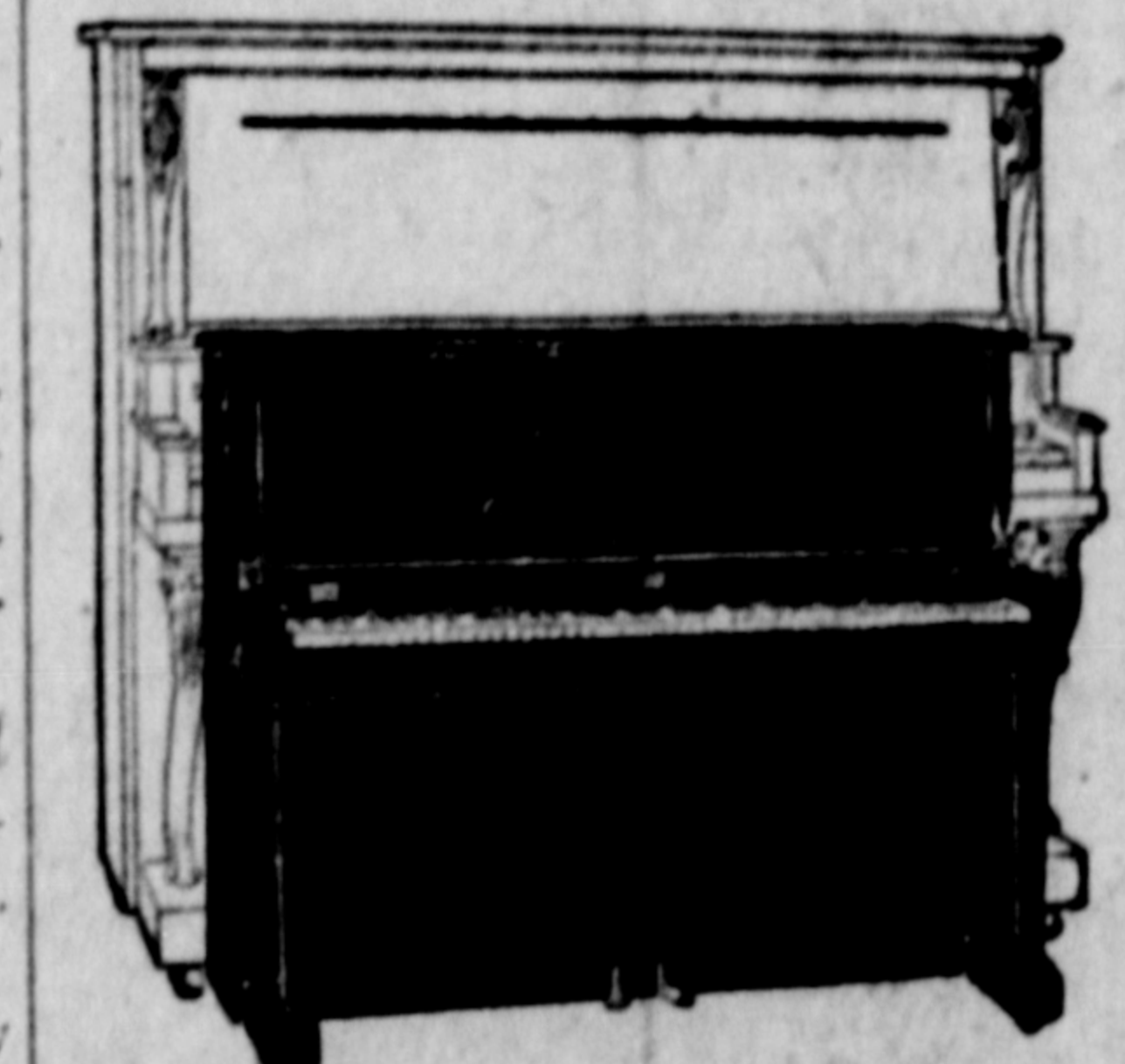

SPRUCE WAS BULK OF TIMBER FOR PULP IN STATES LAST SEASON

WASHINGTON, Aug. 24.—Department of Commerce announces that the total consumption of pulp wood was 5,518,842 cords by 241 mills in 1922, against 4,537,179 cords by 251 mills in 1921. Consumption of wood in 1922 increases 21.8 per cent compared with the previous year but decreased 9.2 per cent compared with 1920, which year was the most active on record in the industry.

More than 54 per cent of the wood consumed in 1922 was spruce. Hemlock and yellow pine were next in importance, supplying 16.1 per cent and 6.7 per cent respectively.

Production on wood pulp was 3,521,644 short tons in 1922 compared with 2,875,691 tons in 1921. Of the total in 1922, 1,483,787 tons were produced by the mechanical process, 1,374,319 tons by the sulphite process, 419,857 tons by the soda process, and 243,681 tons by the sulphate process.

Maine, Wisconsin and New York are the leading states in this industry. In 1922 these three states reported 56.8 per cent of the total consumption of pulp wood and 59.7 per cent of the total production of wood pulp.
