CITY COUNCIL HAS TEMPEST

Ald. Stephens Dubs Ald. Munro's Favored Water Connection Iniquitous Measure

A report from the Board of Works recommending that a water connection be granted to J. Sherman for his residence on lot 7, block 28, section 5, caused general difference of opinion and a direct clash between Ald. Munro, chairman of the board of works, and Ald. Stephens, chairman of the finance committee, at last night's council meeting. Finally it was decided to hold the report over for a week.

The city engineer reported 350 feet of half-inch pipe would be required and it would cost \$100 to make the connection.

Ald. Munro admitted that the connection would not be a paying proposition unless other properties came in on it. However, all these properties had been paying their share in general taxation of the cost of installing the water system. It was hard to get along without water and the house in question had been supplied from the overflow of the reservoir which was not good. There was a possibility that the connection proposed might be used by others. In reply to a question by Ald. Stephens, Ald. Munro stated the report was signed by him and had his endorsement.

Mayor Newton stated that the Board of Works had tried to obtain a 50-50 plan of payment between the city and Mr. Sherman but had failed.

Breach of Faith
"Then why should the city give in?" asked Ald. Stephens, who declared that by making such a connection the door would be opened for great abuses of civic funds. This was only one utility and it might lead to requests for a sidewalk and telephone and light connections. By making such a connection it would take 8 1/2 years for the city to get its money back provided the property paid steadily for the utility. It was not a business proposition and would constitute a breach of faith with the property owners with waste of money. If the city was to put in all the utilities to the property in question it would have a bigger interest in the property than Mr. Sherman himself.

Ald. Munro pointed out that the work done this year to the water system on Fifth Avenue West would take 8 or 10 years to be paid back.

Ald. Mackenzie was in favor of giving the service of the utilities to all property owners.

In reply to Ald. Munro, Ald. Stephens was inclined to question the statement that the Fifth Avenue West water system would take 8 or 10 years to repay. In any case it served more than one or two places, was a trunk line and carried fire protection. Ald. Munro was either insincere in

endorsing this report or he had had a decided change in spirit for only two weeks ago he (Ald. Munro) had told him (Ald. Stephens) that the making of the connection would not be right.

Denies Accusation
Ald. Munro replied that he had not made such a statement. He had said that it would not be a paying proposition.
"In reply, I would like to say that I am not in the habit of making loose statements," stated Ald. Stephens. "I have been in this city longer than Ald. Munro and am perhaps known to more people than he is and if it comes to a question between his veracity and mine I am quite willing that the public should judge."

Ald. Macdonald suggested that the matter be left over a week. Hearing conflicting statements, he for one was not decided which way to vote. The suggestion was adopted and the matter was laid over.

Ald. Stephens urged that if any move had been made to have a light connection made that it be stayed by the utilities committee.

RESOLUTION FROM CITY OF NANAIMO RECEIVED

Asks that Municipalities be Allowed to Use Share of Motor License Fees for Local Improvements

A resolution submitted by the city council of Nanaimo requesting the provincial government to allow municipal councils to use their share of motor license fees for the payment of paved street costs thus relieving local improvement taxation did not receive a very favorable reception when it was dealt with by the Prince Rupert city council last night. It was referred to the finance committee for report.

Ald. Stephens was opposed to the principle involved in the resolution. Revenue so acquired he thought should continue to go to the general fund of the municipality as it did at present. To use it in relieving certain local improvement work would be unfair to the general taxpayers. Those paying local improvement taxes got the benefit of it anyway. Ald. Stephens pointed out that the general fund of the city already received 50 per cent of these fees.
