

He was not inclined to the belief that such action was necessary to the industrial self - preservation of the Canadian people. Canada! would prosper most by allowing ! all people to work. There were! unlimited industrial possibilities which gave room for all people. If Canada, through the use of Oriental labor, could produce more cheaply, it would be to her commercial advantage. Japan. while not desiring to lose her people, placed no obstacles in their way of coming to Canada and whites were welcomed in Japan. Mr. Sato took the view that if the Orientals could compele to the disadvantage of the whites in labor, it was an indication that the whites were inclining towards a life of ease and luxury. 
