## NEARLY A THOUSAND PEOPLE USE LIBRARY

Meeting Last Night Heard Satisfactory Report from Librarian as to Work

At a meeting of the library board last night, the Librarian reported that close to a thousand people were now using the library, the exact number being 982. The average number of books taken out each day during February was 135, the highest number in any day being on Saturday, February 24 when 317 were taken out.

A number of matters were discussed formerly but left over to come up as soon as the library estimate has been passed by the city council. The bills for the month were passed including a number of which have been paid this year for putting the building into shape, such as repairs to the roof and fittings for the stove and some minor carpentry work. This puts everything in good condition except for some plastering on the chimney where the rain still comes in.

The matter of insurance for the books was left over until the estimate is passed.

In the absence of the chairman, Rev. G. G. Acker, H. F. Pullen presided and there were present Mrs. Kirkpatrick and Messrs. Wilkinson and Fuller.

### CHANNEL ISLANDS ASKED AID BRITAIN

LONDON, March 7.—The Government, following on the recommendation of the Geddes Committee, have invited the Channel Islands to make an annual contribution to the Imperial Exchequer "in view of the serious condition of the finances of Great Britain as a consequence of the war." The amounts suggested are £275,000 in the case of Guernsey and £325,000 in the case of Jersey. The letter of the Home Secretary to the authorities of the two islands points out that the United Kingdom apart from the war contribution of £100,000 made by each island has borne the full burden of the Imperial services from which the inhabitants of the islands derive the same benefits as the inhabitants of the United Kingdom.
