ST. JOHNS, Nfd., March 7 .- The crew of the British schooner A. B. Barteaux was landed yesterday by the Norwegian ship Hauk which found them partly frozen and exhausted on an ice floe on which their schooner went to pieces. They dragged . their lifeboat from floe to floe, flagging with oilskins atop of an oar by day and burning bits of oilskins by night in the hope + that their signal might catch the eye of some passing ship.
